- Partake in student-led tutorial sessions with college tutors



What is AVID?

AVID (Advancement Via Individual Determination) is an **internationally recognized program** designed to prepare students for success in four-year colleges and universities. AVID is an elective class which focuses on writing, inquiry, collaboration, organization, and reading. AVID students receive targeted support in a small group setting to support them in their college prep, honors, and AP classes.

AVID Objectives

- To develop students' academic skills so they may enroll and succeed in the most rigorous college preparatory, honors, and AP classes.
- To improve students' college level entry skills, such as note-taking, organizational, and reading/writing skills.
- To ensure that students meet the eligibility requirements of four-year colleges and universities.
- To assist students in the college application process.
- To provide students with knowledge of scholarships and financial aid opportunities.
- To provide students with personal mentoring.

Who Can Be in AVID?

Students who have the **potential** and **motivation** to qualify to attend a four-year university or college as well as the following criteria:

- Minimum 2.0 GPA (2.5 recommended)
- Young men and women who are responsible and determined to succeed
- Students who face a barrier that keeps them from going to college: home life, money, or the first in the family to go to college

- Participate in Collaborative Study Groups with College Facilitators
- Critical Reading and Writing Curriculum
- College Research/Visits
- Organization/Time Management Skills
- Reinforce Study/Test-taking Skills
- Apply to Colleges/Scholarships/ Financial Aid
