### Who Can Be in AVID?

Students who have the **potential** and **motivation** to qualify to attend a four-year university or college as well as the following criteria:

- Have a minimum 2.0 GPA (2.5 recommended)
- Have the ability and desire to complete college preparatory/AP course work
- Are willing to commit themselves to completing daily homework and maintaining a 2.5 GPA or higher
- May be first generation in family to attend college
- Desire to have a program that provides college preparatory skills and opportunities
- Have regular attendance and good work habits
- Have appropriate classroom behavior
- Possess individual determination and a sense of responsibility, humility, and maturity

# How Do I Enroll in AVID?

- Complete the AVID application.
- Get an academic teacher recommendation.
- Get copies of most current report card/transcripts, attendance record, and standardized test scores.
- Return all forms to FUHS by application deadline.
- Interview with the FUHS Coordinator/ AVID Site Team.
