

LOS ANGELES FIRE RESOURCES As of January 9, 2025

Housing

- Airbnb: <u>211 LA</u> is partnering with Airbnb to offer free temporary housing for people displaced from their homes due to wildfires. <u>More info here.</u>
- YMCA of Metropolitan Los Angeles: YMCA of Metropolitan Los Angeles is <u>opening its</u> <u>locations</u> that aren't affected by the fires for temporary shelter, showers, basic amenities, and mental health support. They are also providing childcare services (5 years and up) for first responders and families affected by the fires.
- Queen Mary: <u>The Queen Mary hotel in Long Beach announced</u> that it will be pricing rooms for fire evacuees at \$189. The reservation will include a voucher for a breakfast buffet for two people. The reservation will also waive pet and Historical Preservation fees.
- **Big Bear**: The popular retreat spot has also offered evacuees a peaceful place to turn to for rest and regathering. A collection of vacation homes and hotels is listed on <u>this page</u>, which has been created specifically for the needs of fire evacuees.
- Visit Anaheim: People affected by the wildfires can visit <u>Visit Anaheim's official website</u> and find special hotel offers and assistance.
- U-Haul is offering 30-days of self-storage and U-box rentals for free to fire evacuees and affected families. 92 facilities are participating, in L.A. Orange County, the Inland Empire and elsewhere. Check this document for contact info.

Transportation

- Uber: Residents in Los Angeles County who've been ordered to vacate their homes can get a credit from Uber to get to an evacuation site. The \$40 will only be valid for trips to an active shelter and by using the code WILDFIRE25.
- Lyft: Lyft announced it will be offering \$25 vouchers, valid for two trips, to 500 customers from now until midnight on Jan. 15. Use the code CAFIRERELIEF25 to get the promotion.

Food

Utilities

- AT&T: The telecommunications company announced it is offering wildfire areas unlimited data, talk and text through Feb. 6. Visit their <u>official site</u> for a list of valid zip codes.
- Verizon: Verizon announced it will waive call, text and data charges for customers in hardest hit areas. The company also <u>deployed free Wi-Fi and charging stations at three wildfire shelters.</u>
