Spring Semester Deadlines to Drop an Additional Class and/or Course Level

If a student has an additional course and they wish to drop the class without penalty, they have until 3 PM on Friday, January 22, 2021 to do so. Per district policy, students in grades 9-11 must be enrolled in a minimum of 6 classes and students in grade 12 must be enrolled in a minimum of 5 classes. To request to drop an extra course, the student may email their school counselor directly. If a student is in an Honors, Advanced Placement (AP), International Baccalaureate (IB) and/or Cambridge course and wishes to request to move down in levels, they have until 3 PM on Friday, March 12, 2021 (end of the 3rd grading quarter) to do so. To request a level change, the parent/guardian and student must send a joint email to their child's school counselor. As long as there is room in the lower-level course and it will work with the student's schedule, the request can be accommodated.

2021-2022 Course Registration & 2021 Summer School Registration

For current 9th - 11th graders, the 2021-2022 course registration as well as summer school 2021 process is scheduled to take place in February. During this process students will participate in grade-level registration presentations by the counselors and then submit registration forms. We also conduct registration for summer school during this time. If you earned a D or an F in the fall semester, plan to be available for summer school in June. If you need to take the required Health class during summer school, you may register for this class as well. Details and dates for registration will be announced soon.

School Counselor Google Classrooms

Check your school counselor's Google classroom weekly and utilize their daily drop-in Student Support times as needed.



SENIOR REMINDERS - CLASS OF 2021

Communication From The Colleges To Which You Applied



Be sure that you are checking all of communications and application websites/portals from the colleges to which you applied, so that you don't miss any deadlines or notifications/updates. Failure to meet a college's deadline may result in the cancellation of your application.

<u>Maintain Your Grades</u>

Low grades (i.e., D/F grades) may impact admission decisions and/or eligibility. If you earn a D or F mark in the fall semester, notify the colleges to which you applied in writing (i.e., email).

Financial Aid

File your FAFSA or CADAA (Dream Act) application ASAP (by the March 2nd deadline for Cal Grant eligibility). Additionally, if required by you college financial aid office, file the CSS Profile by their deadline.
