In a normal non-ongoing pandemic situation, we would have held our Open House yesterday evening on January 20th. Because of the ongoing Omicron surge the entire FJUHSD has postponed all Open Houses to a later date. While not a replacement for Open House, we did hold a Virtual Troy Tech/IB/Cambridge Information Night last evening, followed by Troy's ASB Student Showcase. With our state of the art film, television, and music studio and broadcast by our terrific Omnia Studio team with the guidance of their instructor, Dr. Jesse Knowles and Mr. Daniel Flanagan, we were able to stream this event live through YouTube. We still have COVID-19 test kits available for each student. These COVID-19 test kits were provided by The California Department of Public Health (CDPH) and we have been given an allotment of one test kit for each student.

It is the intent of these kits to reduce the amount of time students may be out of school due to COVID-19, per current CDPH guidelines for when a student may return to school. We are continuing the distribution of the COVID-19 home test kits for students at Troy High School and

it is still prioritized through for those students who are experiencing symptoms or believe they have been recently exposed. Students, if you or your parents for you, have not yet picked up a COVID-19 test kit starting Monday during Break and Lunch you may do so from Ms. Vargas-Segura. Reminder, COVID-19 test kits are not to be used at school. The Fullerton Joint Union High School District will not be monitoring test outcomes but will be available to provide resources and respond to any positive result.

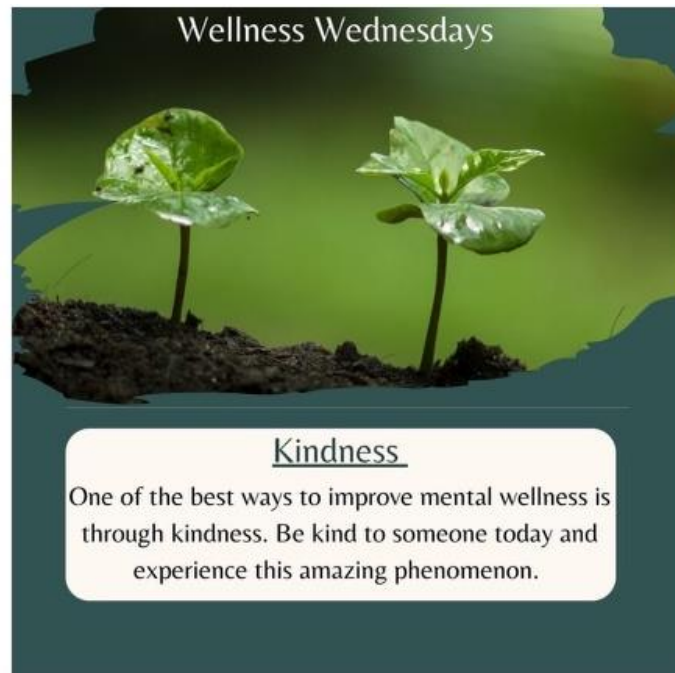

COVID-19 Reminder for all Troy High School Students!

In accordance with the Center for Disease Control (CDC), CA Dept. of Public Health (CDPH), and Orange County Health Care Agency (OCHCA), we ask that you complete the Qualtrics survey each morning prior to arriving on campus. However, **please do not attend school** if you have experienced any COVID-related symptoms:

- Flu-like symptoms such as fever of 100.4 or greater
- Chills
- Cough
- Sore throat

- Runny or stuffy nose that is not associated with a pre-existing condition or other chronic health condition.

Following the recommendations issued by the Centers for Disease Control (CDC), the California Department of Public Health (CDPH) has issued guidance in support of full in-person instruction and to as much instructional time as possible. Please note that masks will be required by all staff and students while indoors regardless of vaccinated status. As an extra precaution, FJUHSD is committed to continuing the enhanced cleaning procedures established to ensure that our schools are clean, sanitized, and safe.

Safety Procedures for attending school during the COVID-19 pandemic.

- All students and staff will complete the Qualtrics COVID Safety Survey each morning (the survey will be sent to your school email).
- To enter campus, students will show their green checkmark from the completed survey permitting them to be on campus.
- Students will walk through the thermo-imaging temperature cameras by either the Main Office or the North Gym and show their green Qualtrics survey checkmarks.
- Face coverings (masks) are required inside and are optional while outside.
- Last but not least, **if you have taken a COVID-19 test** and are still waiting for results, **please do not attend school until you receive the results of that test,** and then **only come to school if you are negative for COVID-19!**

Spring Semester Deadline to Drop an Additional Class or Class Level:

Students may request to drop down in course levels (i.e., H/AP/IB/C to the lower level) if space is available or drop an additional class. Students in grades 9-11 must be enrolled in a minimum of 6 classes and students in grade 12 must be enrolled in a minimum of 5 classes. The deadline for a level change or to drop an additional class is Friday, March 18th by 3:00 p.m (end of the third grading quarter). Students must see their counselor in person before first period, at break, lunch or after sixth period by the deadline. If a student is in an Honors, Advanced Placement (AP), International Baccalaureate (IB) and/or Cambridge course and wishes to request to move down in levels, they have until 3 PM on Friday, March 18th to do so. To request a level change, the student is to see their school counselor in-person at break, lunch, before first period or after sixth period. Parent/guardian permission is required. As long as there is room in the lower-level course and it will work with the student's schedule, the request can be accommodated.
