STEM of our Humanity originated as Helen Fang's Creativity, Activity, Service (CAS) project for the International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme. Driven by a deep appreciation for both STEM and the Humanities, Helen was inspired to take action after reading a New Yorker article on the nationwide decline of English majors. This reflection sharpened her awareness of similar trends at her own STEM-centric high school, where the Humanities are often undervalued.

Determined to reframe this narrative, Helen turned to documentary filmmaking—a medium she had never explored before—as a way to highlight diverse perspectives and tell a more complete story. With the invaluable collaboration of fellow Troy High School students Amy Pham and Gia Desai, the team transformed a conceptual idea into a full-fledged documentary. Over the course of more than 250 hours spanning four months, their shared vision came to life with their documentary, STEM of Our Humanity, featuring interviews with Troy students Aditya Peddi, Cloris Shi, Soham Dev and teachers Mrs. Varieur and Mr. Sutton. They were also able to gain insights from STEM industry professionals as well as students and professors from Stanford, Columbia, Berkeley, and more.

Following months of planning and coordination with their IB supervisor Mrs. Varieur, Vice Principal Mr. Padgett, and the theater production team, the *STEM of Our Humanity*

documentary was formally screened for the first time on April 16, 2025. Held in the Thomas Moore Auditorium, the event welcomed approximately 200 students and faculty members for an afternoon of reflection, insight, and reimagining the role of the Humanities in STEM education and careers.

If you missed the screening, look out for the final product on Youtube, which will be released soon to their instagram @stem.of.our.humanity as well as their website, which is underway.

Troy has amazing students, and I recently received notice from the U.S. Department of Education that our own Ms. Cloris Shi was selected as one of only 621 semi-finalists to advance to the final round of the 2025 U.S. Presidential Scholars Program! From the 621 semi-finalists, up to 161 U.S. Presidential Scholars will be selected.

As the final process to select the students who will become Presidential Scholars began in April, we should know in the next couple of months. Once the Department of Education has completed the selection of the high school seniors who will be named as the 2025 U.S. Presidential Scholars, then the names of those students will be announced by U.S. Secretary of Education, Linda McMahon.


