ELIGIBILITY AND ADMISSION QUALIFICATION

Must meet the following selection criteria of:

- Completed Application (form included in this packet)
- Completed Performance/Behavioral Contract (form included in this packet)
- Copy of most recent standardized test scores
- Unofficial copy of junior high transcript with first semester 8th grade grades
- Copy of school discipline record or letter from school counselor detailing student's conduct in junior high.
- Available Space as limited by the facilities of Fullerton Union High School (FUHS), the size of our feeder junior high population, and the FJUHSD open enrollment policy.

Obtaining, if necessary, an appropriate attendance permit approved by the home school district of residence and the Fullerton Joint Union High School District.

- Students who do not live in the Fullerton Union High School attendance area who are transferring from private schools must obtain a transfer appropriate to the resident school.
- Intra-District transfer students (living within the FJUHSD) who have not done open enrollment must present a copy of their FUHS Special Program acceptance letter and obtain the Intra-district transfer from the high school of residence. Intra-District transfers are only considered during the start of the school year.
- Inter-District transfer students (living outside the FJUHSD) must obtain a request for transfer form from their home school district. This form should be completed and presented along with a copy of their FUHS Special Program acceptance letter to their resident district.
- Obtain, if necessary, an inter-SELPA agreement approved by both the Special Education Local Program Area (SELPA) that serves the student's school district of residence and the North Orange County SELPA.
- The ability of FUHS to meet the educational needs of the student applicant based on the student's IEP and/or 504 Accommodation Plan.
- Physical space limitations may be a factor in accepting out-of-district students.

ACADEMY ELIGIBILITY

All FUHS Special Programs are three years. Applicants who have met the requirements by the due date, will receive a letter of notification. Incomplete applications - missing any of the necessary items – will not be considered for entrance in the initial applicant pool. Subsequent candidates' acceptance will depend upon available space

ACADEMY OF THE ARTS

The Mission of the Academy of the Arts is to provide an elevated and accelerated program to students in north Orange County who have an exceptional need, interest, or talent in the arts. Students can be involved in performing arts through Choral Music, Dance Instrumental Music and Theatre. One of the signature programs in the performing arts is the Triple Threat Program for students interested in Musical Theatre. Students can be involved in the Visual Arts through Digital Arts, Photography, and Visual Arts.



AGRICULTURE ACADEMY

The Agricultural Academy is a career technical program that introduces students to the elements of plant science, animal science, agriculture business, California Agriculture, leadership and FFA (Future Farmers of America). Students will have the opportunity to gain field experience through the development of a supervised agricultural experience. As a vehicle for developing leadership skills, students will be exposed to the FFA and its opportunities. This comprehensive program prepares students for future college and career success.



AVID

AVID's mission is to close the achievement gap by preparing all students for college readiness and success in a global society. AVID (Advancement Via Individual Determination) is a college readiness system designed to increase the number of students who enroll in four-year colleges.



B.E.A.S.T. (Biology, Engineering, Arts, Science, Technology)

BEAST is the Biology, Engineering, Arts, Science Technology Program at Fullerton Union High School and is part of the growing Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts & Mathematics or (STEAM) based education movement. A unique program, BEAST students imagine, design, and create "creature characters" employing the skills of the artist, the understanding of the biologist, and the methods of the engineer.



CULINARY ARTS

The Culinary Academy offers a four-year sequence of courses that provides training in the basic

techniques of professional food preparation and service. The industry driven curriculum includes but is not limited to: sanitation and safety, use of equipment, menu planning, quantity food production, event planning, catering, recipe costing, and customer service.



JROTC

JROTC focuses on developing leadership skills and promoting physical fitness in the cadets enrolled. Throughout the course, cadets are taught the curriculum of our JROTC program along with many life skills that can not be learned by sitting in a classroom. Our primary goal is to "Motivate young people to be better citizens."



SPEECH AND DEBATE

Speech and Debate, or Forensics, requires students to collaborate, think critically, listen critically, exude confidence, evaluate text, write arguments, and learn how to function in real-world settings. Our students are offered the opportunity to compete locally and nationally. For this reason, our competitive students all join the largest speech honor society in the world--The National Speech and Debate Association. Through this honor society, students are provided extra resources, training, and scholarship opportunities.

Special Education students must obtain an inter-SELPA agreement approved by both the Special Education Local Program Area (SELPA) that serves the student's school district of residence and the North Orange County SELPA.

Students who do not live in the FUHS attendance area or are transferring from a private school, must obtain a transfer appropriate to the school district of residence. An attendance permit approved by both the student's home school and Fullerton Joint Union High School District (FJUHSD) is required. Students accepted to FUHS during the District's period of Open Enrollment must still apply to a specialized program. All applicants will be sent a letter of acceptance or non-acceptance after the application is reviewed.

PERFORMANCE AND BEHAVIORAL CONTRACT

Students attending Fullerton Union High School and enrolled in a Special Program must adhere to the following guidelines:

- 1. Maintain a 2.0 grade point average.
- 2. Maintain satisfactory progress towards graduation.
- 3. Maintain satisfactory citizenship (no U's).
- 4. Maintain satisfactory attendance (no cuts).
- 5. Maintain Academic Honesty.
- 6. Not be subject to disciplinary action resulting in suspension or expulsion.
- 7. Inter-district and Intra-district transfer students must remain enrolled in a Special Program course each semester.*
