





# AB 469; REQUIREMENT

Legislation that requires all California high school seniors to complete a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) or California Dream Act (CADAA) and Fullerton Joint Union High School District is required to confirm the submission of either application, per California Ed Code Section 51225.7

This requirement expands financial aid opportunities for many students who may not have the resources to attend a two-year community college or a four-year college or university



### TYPES OF FINANCIAL AID

### SCHOLARSHIPS- LOCAL AND NATIONAL

This type of free money, which is sometimes based on academic merit, talent, or a particular area of study, can make a real difference in helping you manage your education expenses.

#### **GRANTS (FEDERAL/STATE)**

Cal Grants are only if you are going to school in California

A grant is a form of financial aid that doesn't have to be repaid (unless, for example, you withdraw from school and

owe a refund)

#### **WORK STUDY**

The Federal Work-Study Program allows you to earn money to pay for school by working part-time.



### **04** FEDERAL LOANS

Unsubsidized v Subsidized

"Unsubsidized" starts with a "U" because

"you" start accruing interest right away
on an unsubsidized loan.

### PRIVATE SCHOLARSHIPS

As you plan to pay for college, start by applying for federal and state financial aid. Even so, financial aid may not cover all your college costs. Scholarships all have their own requirements, forms, and deadlines.

## PROCESS TO COMPLETE THE APPLICATION



Step 1: Students and Parents Create an FSA ID

- You will need your Social Security Number and a personal email address (do not use your school email)
- Your parent will ALSO need to create an FSA ID

Step 2: Complete either the FAFSA or CADAA

**Step 3**: Submit the Application

Step 4: Upload Proof of completion to Sonora via Google Form
