WHAT IS OPEN ENROLLMENT?

Between January 17 - February 3, 2023

Open Enrollment allows students residing within the FJUHSD boundaries an opportunity to apply for enrollment in any FJUHSD schools. This must begin at your current school of residence.

PROOF OF RESIDENCY IS REQUIRED AT TIME OF APPLICATION!

Please provide a gas, water, or electricity bill AND Rental Agreement/Mortgage statement.

YOU DO NOT NEED TO APPLY IF YOU WISH FOR YOUR STUDENT TO ATTEND THE SCHOOL OF RESIDENCE.

- Discuss Course Request with a Counselor
- Incomplete enrollment packets will NOT be accepted.

Registration materials must be submitted no later than March 17, 2023, at 3:00 PM, or students risk losing their Open Enrollment status.

AERIES PARENT DATA CONFIRMATION



Parent Data Confirmation is a feature of Aeries that allows Parents to verify and or update Student demographics, contacts, medical conditions, view and agree to school policies, and update authorization information.

This process creates an updated <u>Emergency Card</u> that is <u>required</u> to be printed, signed, and turned in at <u>Orientation</u>.

In July, each family will receive detailed information regarding the Data Confirmation process.


Program/Pathway

Raider Revolution

- All 9th grade students will have a Raider Revolution
 Tutorial period on their schedule shown as 8th Period RR.
- Students will report directly to their Tutorial right after period 4.
- Students should use this additional time for academic support to work on homework, Google Classroom, or visit another teacher/subject.
- All students must report and check in with their assigned tutorial class before going to another teacher. If you need to go to a different tutorial, you will need to get a pass from your assigned teacher indicating that you are allowed to go to a different class.
- A tutorial is **NOT OPTIONAL.**

A-G ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

The A-G College Entrance Requirements are a sequence of high school courses that students must complete with a grade of "C" or better to be minimally eligible for admission to the University of California (UC) and/or California State University (CSU).


A 'D' IS NOT A PASSING GRADE FOR A-G


Students must complete all College Preparatory / AP / IB courses with a grade of "C" or better.

UC SCHOOLS

- To be considered for admission, students must complete at least 15 A-G courses with a grade of "C" or better. At least 11 A-G courses must be completed prior to Senior year.
- Take the ACT with Writing Test or SAT Reasoning Test with Essay by December of Senior year. (OPTIONAL*)
- Must have <u>at least</u> 3.0 GPA in A-G courses for minimum eligibility.

CSU SCHOOLS

- To be considered for admission, students must complete at least 15 A-G courses with a grade of "C" or better.
- Take the ACT or SAT Reasoning Test by December of Senior year. (OPTIONAL**)
- Must have <u>at least</u> a 2.0 GPA in A-G courses for minimum eligibility.
- Admission competitiveness varies by major and CSU campus.
