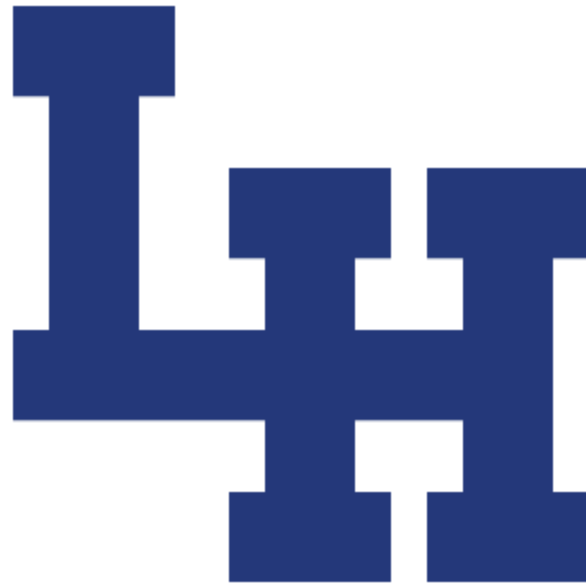

HIGHLANDER ACADEMICS OVERVIEW

Advanced Placement Courses – LHHS offers a wide range of AP and Honors courses in a variety of academic areas, including Art, English (Language & Literature), French, Spanish (Language & Literature), US History, European History, Government, Economics, Psychology, Human Geography, Calculus (AB), Biology, Physics, and Environmental Science, Computer Science.

Agricultural Science and Mechanical Technology (Welding) – This program offers students a variety of college preparatory science classes that follow state standards while developing an understanding of agriculture, California's largest industry. Students are provided the opportunity to raise livestock animals, develop premier leadership skills, and participate in a variety of FFA events. LHHS is one of the last comprehensive schools in the state that continues to offer agriculture, metal technology (welding), and fabrication as part of the agriculture program.

Athletics – LHHS is a member of the California Interscholastic Federation and participates in twenty-three different sports. More than fifty teams of student athletes from all four grade levels represent our school. The Highlanders have a history of success since 2000, earning forty Freeway League Championships and nine CIF Championships.

Forensics Police and Fire Academy (FPFA) – Recognized by "Project Tomorrow" and Court TV's "Forensics in the Classroom," The Forensics, Police and Fire Academy is a comprehensive, four-year UC approved program designed to prepare students in the Forensics, Police and Fire Sciences. This program offers an interdisciplinary approach in the core areas of Science, English and History classes. In addition, FPFA offers courses which include; Introduction to Fire Technology, Introduction to Medical Careers, EMR and EMT. We also offer courses taught after school by Fullerton JC instructors that count for college Credit.

Heritage Humanities Magnet – This rigorous, dual-strand magnet integrates Social Science and English in enriched courses for both AP and accelerated learners. The fast-paced curriculum engages both AP and Traditional Heritage students with hands-on learning activities, field trips, and technology; creative approaches are encouraged. CA Golden Bell award for Curriculum Design.

HiARTS – The performing arts program includes instrumental music (marching band, jazz band, & concert band), choir, theater, and dance production. AP Music Theory and Music Appreciation classes are also offered. The art and design program includes introductory and advanced courses in Drawing & Painting, Photography, Film Production, and 3-D Design as well as Visual Communications and AP Studio Art.

Marketing and Business Academy (MBA) – This Golden Bell Award winning, UC approved, college preparatory program offers a career-related curriculum that produces students who understand the components necessary for success in a career in business and marketing. This interdisciplinary program integrates English, Social Science, and Business classes. Students complete business internships and operate the "Highlander Hub" student store.

NJROTC – The mission of NJROTC is to instill leadership, citizenship, respect, and self-discipline in cadets in order that they may best achieve their personal goals. NJROTC can prepare a cadet for college, the workforce, or military service depending on the cadet's individual plans. Cadets progress through a four year curriculum of followership, leadership, teamwork, critical thinking, and ethics in order to better prepare them for life after high school. Cadets have access to scholarships and opportunities not readily available to other students, and military service after graduation is NOT required.

Regional Occupational Program (ROP) – The goal of the North Orange County ROP is to provide a high-quality, relevant, career and technical education, preparing students grades 9-12 to succeed in employment and post-secondary education. At LHHS, these include Medical Careers, Sports Medicine, Auto Tech, and Culinary classes.
