# PART 1: AERIES REGISTRATION - ONLINE

Use the following site to access Aeries Online Registration and begin the registration process: <u>https://enrollment.fjuhsd.org</u>

<u>Enroll a new student</u> and <u>create an account</u>. In the screen that asks for the student's legal name, on the question "<u>select grade level or program from drop down list</u>" choose "<u>Troy Tech</u>" (the last option). After the email verification section, you can exit and resume later by selecting "Logout" from the upper right menu. To resume when you log in, select "My Account" from the upper right menu to view "Pending Enrollment."

The deadline to create your account and begin the process of electronically submitting the items below is **March 11, 2022**. Upload the following documents:

- 1. BIRTH CERTIFICATE (preferred) or PASSPORT
- 2. MORTGAGE STATEMENT OR RENTAL/LEASE AGREEMENT In custodial parent's name.
- 3. UTILITY BILL Gas, water, or electric in custodial parent's name.
- 4. IMMUNIZATION RECORD Include the following: 4 doses of Diphtheria, Tetanus and Pertussis (DTaP, DTP, Tdap, or Td) and a final dose (Tdap) after 7th birthday; 4 doses of Polio (OPV or IPV); 3 doses of Hepatitis B; 2 doses of Measles, Mumps and Rubella (MMR); and 2 doses of Varicella (Chicken Pox). It is the responsibility of the parent to confirm that requirements are met as set forth by the California School Immunizations Law.
- 5. LAST REPORT CARD/TRANSCRIPT The school counselors will use this to help determine course placements; unofficial transcript is acceptable.
- ELPAC TESTING INFORMATION (English Language Proficiency Assessments for California) This
  optional upload is for any student that has ELPAC testing scores or re-designation paperwork to
  provide from a previous California school.

# PART 2: COURSE SELECTION - IN-PERSON

Come to Troy's Campus at your assigned in-person registration date and time - March 3 or 10, 2022 (date and time were specified in the acceptance email).

Arrive on time and plan to stay for 60-75 minutes. The general presentation in the North Gym will review ninth grade course options followed by small group meetings hosted by Troy counselors where you will receive your student's course registration card with placement recommendations. We have time allotted to answer your questions. The registration presentation slides and handouts will be emailed and posted on the website.

At the end of the session, you will submit Course Selection documents including:

- **1**. Course Registration Card (take a picture for your own record)
- **2**. Troy Tech Requirements
- 3. Home Language Survey
- 4. McKinney Vento Form
- **5**. Summer School Health Course Card (including Emergency Consent on back side)
- G. Last Report Card/Transcript

If you do not complete the instructions in <u>Part 1 Aeries registration ONLINE by March 11</u> AND attend <u>Part 2 Course selection IN-PERSON</u>, we will assume that you are not interested in enrolling your child at Troy and their place will be offered to another student.

#### TROY TECH PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS

Students who have been selected to participate in Troy's magnet program are expected to thrive in its accelerated academic and technical classes. To this end, students must achieve and maintain a standard of excellence as demonstrated by their academic performance, their behavior, and their attendance patterns. The following criteria have been established to advise the program's standards through the capstone senior Internship course.

#### ACADEMIC CRITERIA

Each and every semester, <u>all Troy Tech students</u> must satisfy the following academic requirements:

- Troy Tech students must demonstrate positive and consistent progress in work habits, citizenship, and grades throughout each semester and in each class.
- Troy Tech students must be enrolled in the appropriate Troy Tech course each and every semester of their freshman, sophomore, and junior years. They must be enrolled in the Internship course in the summer directly preceding the senior year or in the senior year itself.
- Troy Tech students must earn a minimum semester grade point average of 2.0 (unweighted).
- Troy Tech students enrolled in a six-period day must earn at least 25 semester units; Troy Tech students enrolled in a seven-period day must earn at least 30 units.
- Regardless of their grade point average, Troy Tech students may not earn a failing grade in any Troy Tech elective (AP Computer Science Principles, Troy Tech Pathways Elective, or Internship)

In addition to the above requirements and regardless of their overall semester grade point average or units earned, <u>**Troy Tech**</u> <u>**Juniors**</u> must satisfy these additional requirements to continue in the program as Troy Tech Interns in their senior year:

- Troy Tech Juniors will be assigned a Pre-Internship Coach and must complete the Pre-Internship component of Troy Tech. Detailed requirements for Pre-Internship can be found in the Troy Tech Pre-Internship Handbook distributed to all Troy Tech Juniors and their parents at the beginning of the junior year. Deadlines are also posted on <u>preinternship.troyhigh.com</u>
- Students with a pattern of excessive absences and/or tardies will not be recommended for Internship.
- Troy Tech Juniors must earn the recommendation of their Troy Tech teachers, program directors and the administrators.

Troy Tech students whose performance does not correspond with these requirements will be removed from the Troy Tech Program and encouraged to seek a program that is more compatible with their ability level, talents, and interests. Students attending Troy on interdistrict transfer permits will be subject to a range of consequences including redirection to their home districts for placement. Students who have been removed from the Troy Tech Program or who leave the program voluntarily will not be eligible for reinstatement.

Students who are demonstrating flagrant disregard for their academic progress within any semester may be considered in violation of behavioral standards; they may be subject to further action as outlined below.

#### ATTENDANCE CRITERIA

Troy Tech students must be enrolled in a full academic course of study at Troy High School to participate in the Troy Tech Program. Furthermore, these students are expected to attend their classes each day and maintain continuous semester-to-semester enrollment in the Troy Tech Program. If a pattern of excused or unexcused absences develops, as determined by a teachers, program directors and/or administrators, the student's enrollment in the program will be brought under review. A student's poor attendance—resulting from excessive excused or unexcused absences—will justify a student's removal from the program. There is no probationary period during which a student may rectify a poor attendance pattern.

Students who fail to meet the attendance requirements will be ineligible to continue in Troy's magnet program; they will be encouraged to seek a program that is more compatible with their ability level, talents, and interests. Students attending Troy on interdistrict transfer permits will be subject to a range of consequences including redirection to their home districts for placement. Students who have been removed from the Troy Tech Program will not be eligible for reinstatement.

#### BEHAVIORAL CRITERIA AND DISCIPLINARY PROBATION

Troy Tech students are expected to abide by the behavioral and academic honesty policies of Troy High School and its individual teachers and classes. A Troy Tech student who has been suspended or whose behavior has been deemed unacceptable by an administrator, a teacher, or another staff member will be placed on Disciplinary Probation. A second behavioral infraction or suspension will result in the student's permanent removal from the program. It should not be construed that Disciplinary Probation is a student's right since a behavioral infraction of a serious nature may result in the student's immediate removal from the Program.

Upperclassmen in the Troy Tech Program are expected to comport themselves as mature, trustworthy young adults and to demonstrate a high level of social conscience. These qualities, along with a strong academic performance, are requisite to a student's commencement into the Senior Internship. Juniors and seniors may be disqualified or removed from Internship, and thus the Troy Tech Program, for behavioral infractions.

Students who fail to meet the behavioral requirements will be ineligible to continue in Troy's magnet program; they will be encouraged to seek a program that is more compatible with their ability level, talents, and interests. Students attending Troy on interdistrict transfer permits will be subject to a range of consequences including redirection to their home districts for placement. Students who have been removed from the Troy Tech Program or have left voluntarily will not be eligible for reinstatement.

Disciplinary Probation may not be offered to a student who is in violation of attendance or academic standards.

#### SENIOR INTERNSHIP REQUIREMENTS

In addition to the academic, behavioral, and attendance requirements, **Troy Tech students** must satisfy the requirements of the Senior Internship. These requirements include but are not limited to:

- Attendance at informational meetings.
- Participation and completion of the 150-hour Internship.
- Participation and attendance at the Mentor Breakfast and Troy Tech Fair.
- Wearing appropriate business attire to their Internship, Mentor Breakfast, and the Troy Tech Fair.

Troy Tech students whose performance does not correspond with these requirements will be subject to deductions from their Internship grade and/or removal from the Troy Tech Program.





#### **World Languages Placement Requirements**

- Freshmen who have successfully completed 2 years of the same target language in Junior High, will be placed in level 2
- Native speakers are encouraged to take a placement exam for corresponding placement.
- Spanish 3 IB- SL and 4 AP is a two-year program. Freshmen will not be placed in Spanish 3 IB-SL or AP.
- Transfer students are encouraged to take the placement exam for appropriate placement.
- Students must earn a C- or better to move onto the next language level.

#### **Placement Opportunity:**

This year's World Languages Placement Exams will be in April 2022. Please contact your counselor to find out the corresponding placement test date. An opportunity is provided to those who have the ability to successfully apply all four language skills (listening, reading, speaking, and writing) to advance from level 1 to level 2.






# **CAMBRIDGE AICE DIPLOMA PATHWAYS**

## **Troy High School**

Diploma candidates need to earn at minimum one credit from each group, plus one point from the core curriculum course, AS Global Perspectives and Research, for a total of seven credits. AS exams are awarded one credit. A Level exams are awarded two credits. Students must complete *both* years of a course sequence to be eligible to take the corresponding A Level exam.





#### What is Link Crew?

Link Crew is a student-led mentorship program that partners incoming freshmen with upperclassmen Warriors who will help them as they transition to Troy High School.

WHAT IS LINK CREW ORIENTATION?

Link Crew orientation takes place alongside regular freshman orientation in August. Here, you'll meet new friends, get to know upperclassmen, tour the campus, and learn more about life here at Troy High School.
