Students must earn a grade of C or better for courses to meet A-G college/university eligibility

All information is provided as a courtesy; however, students should always verify that requirements have not changed

CSU

- To be considered for admission, students must complete at least 15 A-G courses with a grade of "C" or better.
- Must have at least 2.5 GPA in A-G courses for minimum eligibility. Some campuses will consider 2.0-2.49.
- Admission competitiveness varies by major and CSU campus.

UC

- To be considered for admission, students must complete at least 15 A-G courses with a grade of "C" or better.
- For UCs at least 11 A-G courses must be completed prior to senior year.
- Must have at least 3.0 GPA in A-G courses for minimum eligibility.
- Admission competitiveness varies by major and UC campus.

Requirements for 4-Year University



- Course Requirements
 - Must take the required college prep & honors classes for admission - see Academic Rubric.
- Academic Grade Requirement
 - Earn competitive grades
 - **NO** "D's" or "F's" are accepted by 4-year universities for admission
- Test Requirements
 - SAT/ACT not required for Cal State and UC campuses.
 - Private and Out-of-State Public Universities test policies vary by school




- **What:** Free Elective classes offered after school and on weekends

Sunny Hills High School TENTATIVE Summer School Offerings Summer 2024

The Fullerton Joint Union High School District offers two three-week summer sessions for students to retake classes and/or advance in a specific subject area. Each three-week session is the equivalent of one semester earning 5 credits. Most courses run five hours per day, Monday through Thursday.

Health	
Health is a 2 week online course that satisfies the Health graduation requirement. Students are required to attend on the first and last day of the term. In between the first and last term, students can either work from home or use the campus computer lab during summer school hours. Summer school runs Monday - Thursday 1:45pm - 1:55pm.
