Plagiarism:

Where sources are used or referred to, whether in the form of direct quotation or paraphrase, such sources must be fully and appropriately cited. Submitting papers or cutting and pasting text from the Internet is plagiarism.

- Copying answers on assignments from other students' work
- Providing your work to other students to be copied
- Discussing a quiz with someone who has not yet taken it.
- Giving or receiving answers during tests or quizzes
- Using any form of memory aid during tests or quizzes without the permission of the teacher
- Accessing a test or quiz for the purpose of determining the questions in advance
- · Taking a test or quiz from the classroom
- Photographing or texting during a test
- Taking credit for group work when you have not contributed
- Using summaries or commentaries such as Spark Notes in place of reading the assigned materials
- Students are expected to attend all classes during the school day. It is unacceptable
 for a student to cut class in order to prepare for another class. Students caught
 cutting class for this reason may suffer consequences similar to those imposed for
 cheating.
- Social Networking. Soliciting or posting tests, quizzes, or assignments, in whole or in part, on a social network site is considered cheating.
