Dear FJUHSD Students and Parents/Guardians,

We want to thank all of our families for their hard work and flexibility as we started the school year with distance learning. The information below is regarding a possible return to in-person instruction with a hybrid schedule.

As of today, Orange County is trending toward being removed from the Orange County Monitoring Watchlist by the weekend. If the County continues to meet the established threshold for Case Rates (less than 100 per 100,000 people) and Testing Positivity (less than 8%) for three consecutive days, the County will be officially removed from the Monitoring Watchlist. If this occurs, we will need to remain off this list for another 14 consecutive days to then be authorized to reopen for in-person, on campus instruction for those families who prefer the hybrid academic model. Assuming Orange County's numbers continue their current trend or remain stable, in-person academic models could conceivably begin in the OC schools following Labor Day weekend; however, distance learning will continue for one week to allow preparatory time before returning to school in the hybrid model.
