Course Descriptions

AJ 100 - Intro to Law Enforcement - This course provides students with an overview of the American criminal justice system. This course examines the history, development and philosophy of justice administration and summarizes fundamental practices found in law enforcement, the courts and corrections in a democratic society. Transfers to CSU/UC and fulfills GE requirements for IGETC (Area 4) and CSU (Area D).

BUS 100 - Intro to Business - This course is an introduction to the trends and opportunities in today's dynamic global business environment surveying economics, global markets, social responsibility, ownership forms, entrepreneurship, management organization, marketing, accounting and financial management.

COMM 100 - This course is to give students concentrated opportunities to communicate their ideas. Emphasis is on developing the speaker's ability to present original subject matter. This is accomplished by the preparation and presentation of four to six informative and persuasive speeches, as well as various in-class assignments and exercises to develop speaking proficiency by skillfully using logic and reasoning.

COUN 140 - Educational Planning - This course includes: an orientation to college life, responsibilities, requirements, and regulations; an overview of the assessment process; certificates, occupational degrees, and transfer degrees; the transfer process; career guidance for selection of a major plan of study. Students taking this course will receive an overview of graduation requirements, transfer requirements, campus policies, student services, and career planning. Strongly recommended for first-time students.

SOC 101 - Intro to Sociology - This course introduces concepts, theories and vocabulary associated with the field of sociology. The major sociological perspectives are explored surrounding: social control, social interaction, social differentiation, and social institutions. The processes of social change are understood in the context of collective human behavior. This course fulfills the Multicultural Education Requirement for graduation.
