## Succeeding in High School Academic Support

## Succeeding in High School

- Stay Organized! Help your student develop a system so they know where to find each assignment for each class.
- Use Your Planner! Encourage your student to write down their homework assignments in their planner. You can reinforce this by checking their planner daily.
- Ask for Help! If your student is not clear on an assignment or needs help, ask the teacher. It is also helpful to have to contact info for at least 2 students in each class.
