Information and Parent-Student Contract

You've been waiting FOUR LONG YEARS to celebrate your hard work, friendships and achievements. Let make Grad Nite a wonderful night to remember!

<u>Tickets</u>

- The cost of the ticket is \$150 per person (\$130 for BPHS PTSA student members). Cash and money orders are the only forms of payment that will be accepted, with the exception of PayPal purchases.
- To receive discounted rate, BPHS PTSA membership is subject to verification
- Tickets are available to for purchase on Pay Pal. Please include your students name in the notes section when using PayPal. PayPal button can be found on the schools web site under parents-PTSA-GradNite, or you can request an invoice by emailing us at ptsabphs@gmail.com
- PTSA will sell tickets during lunch on the following days:

January 20th, February 24th, March 23rd & March 24th, & April 28th

Students must bring their signed contracts on the day of purchase

- Final on site purchasing dates will be during Senior check out and is subject to ticket availability.
- 130 tickets will be sold on a first come, first serve basis.
- Each ticket will include park unlimited buffet, unlimited rides, a return ticket to Hurricane Harbor, and a Grad Nite souvenir.
- Grad Nite will be at Six Flags Magic Mountain from 9:00p.m. 5:00am (We'll start loading the bus at 4:30am)
- Tickets will be available for BPHS seniors only, no guests.
- Tickets are NON-REFUNDABLE and may not be sold or transferred.
- No replacements for lost/stolen tickets/bracelets, NO EXCEPTIONS.

Distribution of Tickets and Bracelets

- Report in front of BPHS promptly at 5:00 p.m.
- Grad Nite tickets will be distributed to seniors on May 26th before the event starts
- Bracelets for Grad Nite will be distributed as students board the bus.

The Night of the Event

- BPHS and Six Flags dress codes will be strictly enforced.
- Apparel may not have any school logos. No skirts, spaghetti straps or torn jeans.
- Students will report in front of BPHS at 5:00 p.m.
- Students will be asked to join the PTSA GradNite Remind classroom that will be used on the night of the event for general announcements. The code will be provided during check in.
- Students MUST have ticket and bracelet in order to enter the GradNite celebration, <u>NO EXCEPTIONS!</u>
- Students will be assigned to a specific bus based on their last name.
- Students must check in with their chaperone to board the bus and receive a bracelet.
- Once students have boarded the bus, they will not be allowed to get off until the bus has arrived at Six Flags.
- Buses will depart no later than 6:00p.m.
- Students MUST ride on assigned buses to enter Grad Nite. No private cars are allowed.
- Students must have their Six Flags Grad Nite admission ticket ready and their Six Flags Grad Nite wristband on their right arm as they enter the turnstiles, NO EXCEPTIONS!
- Get ready for a security bag check at the park's entrance.
- No students will be allowed in or out of the park without chaperone consent.

Carry-on Items Allowed

- Purses, bags, backpacks should be smaller than 18" width x 25" height x 37" length with only personal items needed for the evening.
- Cell phone and camera
- Jackets, sweaters, coats, sweatshirts
- If student will be taking medication during the event, he/she must communicate this to the Chaperone that will be checking him/her in on the assigned bus.
- Small sealed plastic water bottle (no glass)

During the Event

- Please be courteous and respectful to those around you, including other grads, and Six Flags employees.
- Refrain from using inappropriate language. Please do not run while at Six Flags
- When in queues for attractions, please refrain from yelling at a high volume. The goal of Six Flags is to provide a safe, secure environment for all of our guests to enjoy, and that includes all of you! We ask that you represent yourselves, your school and your generation in a positive light.
- If you need to contact a chaperone during Grad Nite, please see a Six Flags employee at Chaperone Headquarters (Full Throttle Lounge) and your chaperone will be called.
- If you lose items on the night of your Grad Nite, check with a Six Flags employee at the Chaperone Headquarters (Full Throttle Lounge).
- If after your Grad Nite event you realize items were lost or left in a locker, please contact Lost & Found at (661-255-4103).

Students Must Not

- Possess or distribute any material prohibited such as drugs, drug paraphernalia, alcohol, weapons or any gang-related items
- Fight or engage in horseplay
- Harass others for any reason
- Chant school names
- Six Flags is a non-smoking event. No one, regardless of age, will be allowed to smoke at anytime during the event inside the parks.

Important Note

- Keep your GradNite ticket in a safe and secure place and your GradNite wristband on at all times.
- Six Flags is a drug, alcohol, and weapon-free event. Local Law Enforcement will be present upon check-in and during the event and will take appropriate actions if drugs, alcohol, drug paraphernalia or weapons are found. Anyone not adhering to the Six Flags Dress Code guidelines and/or carrying and/or distributing prohibited items will be delayed and/or denied admission to the event.
- If someone is already at the park and he/she is not adhering to Six Flags rules and regulations, the Chair Chaperone and parents/guardians will be contacted. The attendee will be escorted out of the park and/or suffer any consequences as determined by the local law enforcement team.

Parents/Pickup:

• After the Grad Nite Event, the parent/guardian is responsible for picking up the student or arranging for transportation for him/her.
