UNIVERSITY UPDATES



The University of California (UC) system of schools initially moved to a "test optional" policy for the incoming freshman class of 2022.

The California State University (CSU) system of schools cancelled the use of SAT/ACT scores for the current 12th graders but intends to reinstate the old SAT/ACT requirements if possible. At this time, it is unclear if the CSU will be able to reinstate the SAT/ACT requirement for current 11th graders.

For private colleges/universities and out-of-state public schools, please check the school's website to verify, but most schools have moved to a testing optional policy.

The PSAT is an in person, paper/pencil test that will be given on January 26. Sales will begin the week of January 19th via SHHS Webstore only.
