While Super Bowl LIV may not seem that

long ago, this year's rematch will be hosting two substantially different teams since we last saw their historical playoff matchup in 2020.

The San Francisco 49ers have since acquired 5-time pro bowl running-back Christian McCaffrey, who since joining the 49ers has 431 carries for 2,205 yards, scoring 31...

Senior Jeffery Suarez has been a proud driver since May 2023 and is among many other LHHS student who brave our tumultuous main parking lot on a daily basis.



Jeffrey states he considers himself a decent driver, but the parking lot can be very stressful at times. He shares that although it is nerve-racking, he likes to park in the school parking lot because it is much safer compared to other options.

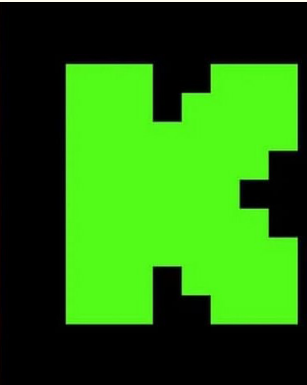
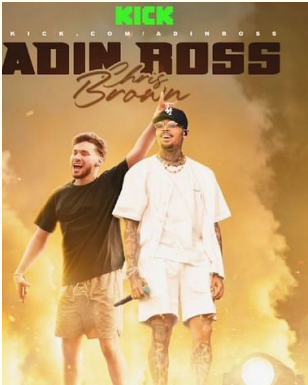

## Super Bowl LVIII: A Rematch for the History Books

The San Francisco 49ers vs. Kansas City Chiefs may be a rematch in name, but how much have their rosters really stayed the same?

(Continued from the front page) touchdowns in just 27 games.

As a result of his success, he’s in the running for this year’s MVP, one of only two non-quarterbacks to be considered. Still, he has other things on his mind.

“It’ll be a big challenge on a big stage, and we’re excited about it,” McCaffrey told press after his two-touchdown masterclass.

Additionally, Brock Purdy will replace Jimmy Garoppolo as quarterback in this anticipated rematch.

In his 2nd year in the league as the last pick in the draft— 1st full year— Brock Purdy has led the 49ers to their 2nd consecutive NFC Championship, recording a passer rating of 113.0 with 31 touchdowns, making history by breaking the 49ers single-season passing record with 4,280 passing yards.

He also led the 49ers to overcome a 17 point deficit after the first half— tied for the biggest comeback in NFC Championship history.

“We knew we had a half left”, stressed the young quarterback during the trophy ceremony as fans chanted his name. “The boys on defense took care of business— we

had the faithful behind us the whole way. We love you guys.”

The Kansas City Chiefs have also made significant changes to their roster since 2020, Isiah Pacheco being one of their notable additions.



The year he was drafted by the Chiefs in 2022, he played a big role in helping Kansas City secure their Super Bowl title with his exceptional speed and explosiveness.

Still, this year’s rematch will be missing a huge name from the Chiefs offense: Tyreek Hill.

In Super Bowl LIV, Hill managed 9 receptions and 105 yards, propelling Kansas City to a victory.

Since moving onto the Miami Dolphins, he’s shown zero signs of regression.

In 2023, Hill recorded 1,799 yards and 13 touchdowns, both first in the NFL— punching his ticket into MVP considerations.

Despite the loss of Hill, Kansas City will still be hosting arguably the best quarterback-tight end duo in the league in Patrick Mahomes and Travis Kelce, who have managed two Super Bowls in their time together.

In the playoffs, they have 133 catches for 1,516 yards and have scored 18 touchdowns in 17 games just between the two of them.

“When the lights get brighter, he plays better,” Mahomes told Yahoo Sports of his tight end. “That’s the true mark of a champion, and that’s what he is.”

Even despite the roster changes since their last Super Bowl appearance versus one another, it would be hard to imagine there be no animosity between the two, given how recent their 2020 matchup was.

Will Kansas City reclaim their dominance over San Francisco on the biggest stage? Or perhaps the 49ers can finally pay back the Chiefs for stealing what could have been their sixth



franchise ring in 2020.

Brock Purdy and the 49ers orchestrated the biggest comeback this season and won 31-34. The 49ers ended the Lions’ season with their quarterback who was picked dead last in the 2022 NFL draft, dubbed “Mr. Irrelevant”. Purdy became very relevant to Lions fans that

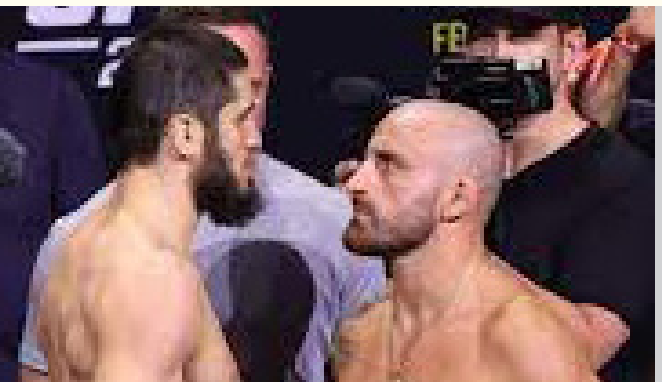

War in the Holy Land

With war happening once again in the Middle East between the Israeli Defense Forces and Hamas (the leaders of Gaza), it seems it is more important now than ever before to see the origins of the conflict that has been going on for generations.

The Holy Land has seen many conflicts in hopes of control of the territory. From Egyptians to Greeks, from Arabs to Jews. Countless have died in hopes of making the Holy Land their home. Today it is all the same, war has sporadically raged on since the end of World War Two.

Jewish people in Europe had developed the World Zionist Organization (WZO) in 1897. Originally the WZO tried to convince the Ottoman Empire to sell Palestine to the Jewish. Theodore Herzl offered twenty million pounds which is about two billion in today’s currency.

Fast forward to the end of WWII; Jewish people in Europe are left scarred and scattered following the treacherous aftermath of the Holocaust; many without a family nor a home to return to. The newly organized United Nations were tasked with finding survivors a home.

On November 19, 1947, the UN adopted the Partition Resolution. The passing of the Partition would divide Palestine into Jewish and Arab states. On May 14, 1948 Israel became an

independent state. The Arab-Israeli war broke out shortly after.

On June 11, 1948, the first truce was written and agreed upon. Following the truce Israeli armies seized previously occupied Palestine.

This trend of war and truce will wage on for many years.

Creation of the PLO (Palestine Liberation



Organization) began in early January 1964. War broke out again during the Six Day War. Egypt, Syria, and Jordan ally themselves with Palestine. In the years following, the UN general assembly confirmed the rights of Palestinians to self-determination, sovereignty, independence, and refuge. In 1974 the PLO became the sole legitimate representative of the Palestinian people.

Revolution began against the Jewish occu-

pation of Israel in 87’ commonly known as the first Intifada. The Oslo Accords were signed and agreed to following the conflict.

Although there was a common ground of agreement Israel continued to transfer their population to illegal settlements in occupied Palestine. The second Intifada began in 2000. Israel built the West Bank Wall much of which was on Palestinian land. The ICJ (International Court of Justice) ruled that the wall inside Palestine was considered illegal. In 2005 Israel withdrew troops and settlers from Palestine.

Following the rise of Hamas in Palestine, much of the world cut off aid to Hamas territory. Israel stopped tens of thousands of people from entering their nation. Israeli airstrikes crippled Gaza’s only electric power plant causing widespread blackouts.

Fast forward to October 7, 2023: Hamas gunmen launched a surprise attack killing hundreds. Israel immediately sought revenge and launched numerous airstrikes causing many casualties.

The conflict between these two peoples is nothing new, but the fact that there are atrocities being committed has left many observers hoping for a resolution of the conflict sooner rather than later.



## World's Oldest Dog Faces Speculations of World Record

The validity of the claim of the world's oldest dog, Bobi from Portugal, is being called into question after an amateur investigation uncovered discrepancies in the birthdate of the recently deceased canine.

Bobi's death was covered by many press and news articles praising the dog for his old age, but as he gained more attention, he also gained more doubters. Some interested people took it into themselves to research his age and see just how real those 31 years were.

When Bobi was officially announced as the world's oldest living dog by GWR, they had stated that Bobi's age was verified specifically by a Portuguese government database for many different types of pets. This verification should have resolved these speculations, but after a fan reached out again, it was revealed that although Bobi's owner had documented his birth year

as 1992, there was no data or registration confirming this.

Unfortunately, in Portugal the documentation of dogs born before 2008 was not required until 2020, leaving the questions around Bobi's age unconfirmed. Many veterinarians have

put their own thoughts into this theory, claiming that many of them don't believe Bobi's age and don't find it possible.

"Not a single one of my veterinary colleagues believe Bobi was actually 31 years old," said Danny Chambers, a professional veterinarian, during an interview with The Guardian.

One expert in dog longevity

named Enikő Kubinyi from Eötvös Loránd University in Hungary shared that many of her doubts come from pictures of Bobi showing he was overweight. She explained that it is much harder for dogs to live longer with extra weight on them, making her believe Bobi's age might've been a hoax.

Also seen from photos, Kubinyi expresses that younger pictures of Bobi next to older pictures of him seem to show that Bobi's fur pattern differed from when he was young to old. This was just another example of inconsistency in Bobi's story and age.

Although many believe that Bobi's age was a hoax, he didn't live as long as his owner claims, and that Bobi does not deserve to hold the record of "World's Oldest Dog", he is still documented in the Guinness World Record and proudly holds the title, nonetheless.



## Endangered Great White Sharks Make Dramatic Comeback

Great White Sharks are making a strong comeback in Southern California after over twenty years of the species being on the brink of extinction.

Great white sharks were on the brink of endangerment starting in the late 1990's after the shark's main food source, seals, were being hunted at above average rates. Now a certain breed of seals called

"Fur seals" have made a population comeback in California, rebounding due to laws preventing the hunting of seals.

Another cause of the Great white's population decline was something called "Shark Finning", which is the cause of the deaths of over 100 million sharks each year. Shark Finning is the illegal practice of cutting the fins off sharks and then leaving the shark in the ocean to suffocate or bleed to death. Shark fins are used for a food called Shark fin soup, which is used as a medicine or eaten as a delicacy in Asia. Not

only is this illegal but extremely painful for the animals and completely immoral.

According to National Geographic, Great



white sharks are at the top of the food chain in the ocean, yet their lives are threatened by illegal hunting.

Student Grace Beasley stated, "I am afraid of sharks, but I am happy they're alive and hope to never run into one at the beach."

Today, there are several Great White Shark nurseries from Del Mar to La Jolla. Since the great white population has grown, there are now around 300 sharks in the SoCal region.

Although there is a growing population of these animals, you should have no fear for your safety as their sharks have been swimming with and around humans their entire lives and there have been no reports of shark attacks since they've been repopulated. However, keep your distance from these animals and fish responsibly.

Humans are responsible for the negative impact on the shark population, and we should stay respectful of their habitat from now on.
