UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA (9 campuses)

(Begin application August 1; submit Application November 1-30)
A. HISTORY/SOCIAL SCIENCE-2 years required

- One year of United States History or one-half year United States History and one-half year of Civics or American Government; one year of World History/Cultures/Geography.
- ENGLISH 4 years required
- Four years of college preparatory English.
- MATHEMATICS 3 years required, 4 recommended C. Algebra 1, Geometry, and Algebra 2.
- LABORATORY SCIENCE-2 years required, 3 recommended Not more than one year of Laboratory Science can be taken in the ninth grade. One year of Physical Science and one year of Life Science.
- FOREIGN LANGUAGE 2 years required, 3 recommended (LANGUAGES OTHER THAN ENGLISH) E. Two years of the same Foreign Language.
- VISUAL AND PERFORMING ARTS 1 year required Art, Music, Theatre, Dance, etc.
- COLLEGE PREPARATORY ELECTIVES 1 year required One year of college preparatory coursework. The coursework can be selected from the following subject areas: History, Social Science, English, advanced Mathematics, Laboratory Science, Foreign Language, and Visual and Performing Arts.

- COLLEGE PREPARATORY ELECTIVES 1 year required One year of college preparatory coursework. The coursework can be selected from the following subject areas: History, Social Science, English, advanced Mathematics, Laboratory Science, Foreign Language, and Visual and Performing Arts.
 - *TESTS REQUIRED: SAT Test OR ACT
 - -SAT Subject Tests not required
 - *Essay IS NOT REQUIRED
 - *NO LETTERS OF RECOMMENDATION

UC/CSU GPA calculated based on 10-11 grades in a-g courses. UC campuses require a 3.0 UC/CSU GPA minimum to apply; CSU campuses require a 2.0 UC/CSU GPA minimum to apply.

COMMUNITY COLLEGES

To be eligible, a student must be 18 years of age or hold his/her high school diploma. The student may participate in a Certificate or Degree Program (start employment at completion of requirements), or participate in the Transfer Program (complete 60+ transferable units and transfer to a four-year institution as a junior.) Placement testing is done in English and Mathematics. The SAT and ACT are not required.

PRIVATE COLLEGES AND UNIVERSITIES AND OUT-OF-STATE COLLEGES AND UNIVERSITIES

Subject requirements vary among private colleges in and out-of-state and among out-of-state public institutions. However, if a student follows the University of California requirements and is eligible for admission to the University of California, the student probably will meet the requirements for many of these schools. The highly selective private colleges and universities recommend a minimum of five (preferably six) academic classes each year. Admissions testing requirements will vary by school. Check with the college or university to see if they prefer the SAT TEST or ACT with Writing, and if they require the SAT SUBJECT

Course Prerequisites

- This presentation contains the prerequisites for certain courses as well as grade requirements to remain in H/AP/IB level classes. It does not cover all course options. Please refer to the Course Offerings Sheet for all classes offered next school year.
- The following courses are open to all students provided they meet the prerequisites. The prerequisites are set by the departments and teachers on this campus.

Honors (H)/IB/AP Level Courses

- To remain in H/AP/IB level courses, students must earn a B- or better BOTH semesters. It is *not an average* of two semesters. Students may not remain in H/AP/IB courses with a C+ or lower in any semester.
- If you earned a B- or higher last semester in an H/AP/IB level course, you may put next year's H/AP/IB course on your course registration card.
- Your spring semester H/AP/IB class grades will be reviewed in the summer. If that grade is below a B-, next year's course level will be changed accordingly.





Moving up to Honors Level Math

■ Earn an A-/A- minimum in your current CP math course. Sometime in April or May, there will be an honors placement test administered by the Math Department. Placement into honors math is based on meeting the A-/A- min. grade requirement and the required test score. For now, please put the math class level that you currently qualify for on your registration card.

JUNIOR REGISTRATION INSTRUCTIONS 2020-2021

- A. PLEASE CHECK THE TROY WEBSITE FOR GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS.
- B. Enter the Course Number and Title of your courses on the Registration Card. Please copy the numbers correctly. Write clearly. Enter all course numbers.
- As a Junior next year, you will be required to take 30 credits (6 classes) each semester including the following required courses. Please make sure that they are listed in the correct space on the Registration Card. In addition, check with your current teachers to verify prerequisites for each course listed on your registration card.
 - 1. ENGLISH 3, English 3 Honors and English IB SL one year, 10 credits.
 - U.S. HISTORY, U.S. History AP one year; 10 credits.
 - SCIENCE Two years; 20 credits (10 credits of a biological science and 10 credits of a physical science)
 - PE or SPORTS If 20 credits have not been completed in grades 9 and 10. Sports requires a teacher recommendation, unless you previously played the sport.
 - MATH –Three years; 30 credits are required to graduate. One year of math must be completed in Algebra I (10 units).
 - VISUAL AND PERFORMING ART/WORLD LANGUAGE/CTE One year of a visual and performing art, one year of a world language, or one year of a career technical course.
 - 7. Any other graduation requirement that should have been completed in the first two years. Please check your transcript and graduation status report carefully to see if you've earned less than five credits per semester in a required course.
- If a course you choose requires a teacher signature, you must have that teacher's signature on the
 proper line of your registration card before you will be enrolled in the course.
- E. Enter your 7th period class in the space provided on the Registration Card. This section may be used for Troy Tech, AVID and/or IB classes.
- F. Select 2 alternate classes for electives. This is <u>mandatory</u> in case a class you have chosen is full or cancelled. The alternate course you select will be placed on your schedule if your first choice class is unavailable, so please choose carefully.
- G. In addition students must also pass Health (2.5 units) for graduation.
- H. Read over the course profiles on the 2020-2021 Registration section of Troy Counseling webpage to assist you in selecting the classes appropriate for both your interest and skill levels. <u>Select your classes</u> wisely as there will be no schedule changes when the fall semester begins.
