UC/CSU GPA calculated based on 10-11 grades in a-g courses. UC campuses require a 3.0 UC/CSU GPA minimum to apply; CSU campuses require a 2.0 UC/CSU GPA minimum to apply.

COMMUNITY COLLEGES

To be eligible, a student must be 18 years of age or hold his/her high school diploma. The student may participate in a Certificate or Degree Program (start employment at completion of requirements), or participate in the Transfer Program (complete 60+ transferable units and transfer to a four-year institution as a junior.) Placement testing is done in English and Mathematics. The SAT and ACT are not required.

PRIVATE COLLEGES AND UNIVERSITIES AND OUT-OF-STATE COLLEGES AND UNIVERSITIES

Subject requirements vary among private colleges in and out-of-state and among out-of-state public institutions. However, if a student follows the University of California requirements and is eligible for admission to the University of California, the student probably will meet the requirements for many of these schools. The highly selective private colleges and universities recommend a minimum of five (preferably six) academic classes each year. Admissions testing requirements will vary by school. Check with the college or university to see if they prefer the SAT TEST or ACT with Writing, and if they require the SAT SUBJECT

Cambridge AICE Diploma Program


Troy is starting the Cambridge AICE Diploma Program in 2020-21. This academically rigorous program requires 4 exams in 4 areas. In order to take an exam, you must take the A1 course followed by the A2 course, which may start next year. Next to some course titles in this presentation, you will see A1. This denotes the course works to fulfill the program requirements.

Cambridge AICE Program Contd.

CAMBRIDGE A.I.C.E. DIPLOMA QUALIFICATION PATHWAY at Troy High School

- 1. Complete two-year course pathways in Groups 1, 2, and 3 with A Level Exams in each Year 2 A Level course.
- 2. Complete the Group 4 course (Cambridge Global Perspectives & Research) and the AS Level Exam.



Course Prerequisites

- This presentation contains the prerequisites for certain courses as well as grade requirements to remain in H/IB/AP level classes. It *does not* cover all course options. Please refer to the Course Offerings Sheet for all classes offered next school year.
- The following courses are open to all students provided they meet the prerequisites. The prerequisites are set by the departments and teachers on this campus.

Honors (H)/IB/AP Level Courses

- To remain in H/AP/IB level courses, students must earn a B-or better BOTH semesters*. It is *not an average* of the two semesters. Students may not remain in H/AP/IB courses with a C+ or lower in any semester*.
- If you earned a B- or higher last semester in an H/AP/IB level course, you may put next year's H/AP/IB course on your course registration card*.
- Your spring semester H/AP/IB class grades will be reviewed in the summer. If that grade is below a B-, next year's course level will be changed accordingly*.
 - *The exception to this is Eng 1H-Eng 2H, that you will see on the next slide...

To level up from English I (CP) to English 2 Honors

You must earn an A- (minimum) both semesters in English 1 (CP). If you earned an A-, or higher, in the fall semester of English 1 (CP), you may put English 2H on your registration card at this time. Counselors will check your spring grade... you must maintain an A- minimum in English 1 (CP) this semester as well as last semester.

To level up from English I (CP) or English I TT to AP English Language & Composition

Students MUST do the following:

- 1. Discuss your interest in leveling up with your current English teacher immediately.
- 2. Earn an A+ both semesters in your current English class.
- 3. In May, meet with your current English teacher again and discuss their recommendation. Additional placement tests TBD at that point.

For now, register for the English class for which you currently qualify.

4. Counselors will receive notification from Department Chairs in May and will then adjust English class levels and placements accordingly.



Moving up to Honors Level Math

Earn an A-/A- minimum in your current college prep (CP) math course <u>AND</u>, sometime in April/May, there will be an honors placement test administered by the Math Department. Placement into honors math is based on meeting the A-/A- min. grade requirement and the required honors placement test score. For now, please put the math class level you currently qualify for on your registration card.



SOPHOMORE REGISTRATION INSTRUCTIONS 2020-2021

- A. PLEASE CHECK THE TROY WEBSITE FOR GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS.
- Enter the Course Number and Title of your courses on the Registration Card. Please copy the numbers correctly. Write clearly. Enter all course numbers.
- C. As a Sophomore next year, you will be required to take 30 credits (6 classes) each semester including the following required courses. Please make sure that they are listed in the correct space on the Registration Card. In addition, check with your current teachers to verify prerequisites for each course listed on your Registration Card.
 - 1. ENGLISH 2, English 2 Honors and AP Language & Composition- one year; 10 credits.
 - SCIENCE Two years; 20 credits are required to graduate (10 credits of a biological science and 10 credits of a physical science).
 - MATH Three years; 30 credits are required to graduate. One year of math must be completed in Algebra I (10 units).
 - PE or SPORTS All students one year, 10 credits in 10th grade. Sports require a teacher recommendation unless you previously played the sport.
 - VISUAL AND PERFORMING ART/WORLD LANGUAGE/CTE- One year of a visual and performing art, one year of a world language, or one year of a career technical course.
 - Any other graduation requirement that should have been completed in the first year. Please check your transcript and graduation status report carefully to see if you earned <u>less than 5 credits</u> per semester in a <u>required</u> course.
- D. If a course you choose requires a **teacher signature**, you must have that **teacher's signature** on the proper line of your registration card before you will be enrolled in the course.
- E. Enter your 7th period class in the space provided on the Registration Card. This section may be used for Troy Tech, AVID and/or IB Classes.
- F. Select 2 alternate classes for electives. This is <u>mandatory</u> in case a class you have chosen is full or cancelled. The alternate course you select will be placed on your schedule if your first choice class is unavailable, so choose carefully.
- G. In addition students must also pass Health (2.5 units) for graduation.
- H. Read over the course profiles on the 2020-2021 Registration section of Troy Counseling webpage to assist you in selecting the classes appropriate for both your interest and skill levels. <u>Select your classes wisely as there will be no schedule changes when the fall semester begins.</u>

Summer School Guidelines

- If you earned a D or an F in a core course, you may sign up to remediate that course for a better grade.
- You may not take a course to skip a level*.
- You may request to take an art class to fulfill the CSU/UC college "f" requirement if you are in a special program that necessitates taking an art class in summer school because there is no other space for it in your plan. You must take both sessions for this.
- You are encouraged to fulfill the Health requirement.
