# AP and IB programs

- ✓Both are very rigorous courses that colleges like to see on high school transcripts.
- ✓ They are the most rigorous courses that Fullerton High offers and are excellent preparation for college.
- ✓Both offer end of course exams that may earn students college credit.





# What is Advanced Placement?

- The Advanced Placement Program is a program that offers college level courses to high school students.
- The courses are more rigorous than the general course offering.
- Courses are stand alone, year long courses.
- Students may enroll in one AP class or multiple AP classes.

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### **IB** learner profile

The aim of all IB programmes is to develop internationally minded people who, recognizing their common humanity and shared guardianship of the planet, help to create a better and more peaceful world.

As IB learners we strive to be:

### NOUIRER:

We nurture our curiosity, developing skills for inquiry and research. We know how to learn independently and with others. We learn with enthusiasm and sustain our love of learning throughout life.

### KNOWLEDGEABLE

We develop and use conceptual understanding, exploring knowledge across a range of disciplines. We engage with issues and ideas that have local and global significance.

### HINKER

We use critical and creative thinking skills to analyse and take responsible action on complex problems. We exercise initiative in making reasoned, ethical decisions.

### COMMUNICATORS

We express ourselves confidently and creatively in more than one language and in many ways. We collaborate effectively, listening carefully to the perspectives of other individuals and groups.

### PRINCIPLEL

We act with integrity and honesty, with a strong sense of fairness and justice, and with respect for the dignity and rights of people everywhere. We take responsibility for our actions and their consequences.

### OPEN-MINDED

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# What is an IB Certificate?

Students do not have to be a diploma student to enroll in IB courses. Like with AP courses, students can pick and choose the IB courses they are interested in and take the same exams as full diploma students. Students can enroll in one or multiple IB courses.





# What is the IB Diploma?

The IB Diploma is a series of six courses taken over the junior and senior years

In addition to the six courses, diploma students also have the following "core" requirements:

- Theory of Knowledge Extended Essay
- Community, activity, and service hours





# What can the IB Diploma do for me?

- College credit as many as 30 total units
- Strengthen your college application
  - Without SATs or ACTs, transcripts matter
  - Colleges know the Full Diploma requirements
- Along with AP coursework the IB courses are the best way to prepare you for the rigors of a university program.
