On Tuesday I attended the annual Early Assessment Program (EAP) College Readiness Breakfast held at Cal State Fullerton. Also in attendance were counselors and administration from every other FJUHSD school and high schools from surrounding districts. The EAP is part of the California state exams in English and Math that our students take in a couple months and it is a measure to determine if students are college ready by the end of their 11th grade year for the rigors of college mathematics and English, or if they need additional support prior to college. The goal is to avoid taking remedial courses in college, thereby extending the number of years in college and number of courses needed to graduate. It was a wonderful event and the keynote speaker was Orange County Superintendent of Schools, Dr. Al Mijares.
