




January 28, 2023

Students! Here is some important information for you from our Troy Counselors. Keep in mind that we are mid-year, so there should be few changes that would result in changing any year long courses. However, should there be a need for a student to make a significant schedule

change, and if class space is available to allow a change, there is a timeline that must be followed. Spring Semester Deadline to Drop an Additional Class or Class Level

Students may request to drop an additional class or drop down in course levels (i.e., H/AP/IB to the lower level), if space is available. Students in grades 9-11 must be enrolled in a minimum of 6 classes; students in grade 12 must be enrolled in a minimum of 5 classes. <u>The deadline to drop an additional class or level down is Friday, March 17, 2023 by 3:30 p.m.</u>

<u>Students</u> must see their school counselor <u>in person</u> before first period, at break, lunch, or after sixth period by the deadline.

- Testing for Troy Tech, International Baccalaureate, Cambridge, or Honors placement: January 28, 2023 (select one) from 7:30-11:45 a.m. Check-in at 7:15 a.m. on January 21st in the North Gym. Bring student photo ID or Passport and printout of 8th grade schedule listing current math course. Testing covers midyear eighth grade content in math and English, and the format includes multiple-choice questions and an English essay. From Coach, Kurt Wahl, "Congratulations to the Troy High School Olympiad Team for taking first place at the prestigious MIT Invitational. This is the fifth time that the Troy Team has won at MIT. This year's competition featured eight of the top ten teams in the Nation. The competition was close, but in the end, Troy finished 19 points ahead of Mountain View, a team from Northern California. The team had many outstanding performances, winning 12 medals in all. The top medal winners were Bella Liu and Anne Hiraki who each won four medals!

Melinda Ji won three medals and Ayushi Mehrota, Andrew Tsai, Ianna Lin each won two."

There is awesome news at Troy High School in the world of Computer Science and in the cyber world of CyberPatriot competition!



Last week Troy High School was notified that our school is recognized by the College Board as one of 832 schools worldwide having earned the AP Computer Science Female Diversity Award for AP Computer Science Principles! This is a great achievement, and representative of our work supporting the desire and need to have more female representation in the world of Computer Science! There is more work yet to be done. Great job, Warriors!

In CyberPatriot, our students are doing well. Very well. Cyber Coach, Mr. Allen Stubblefield wrote, "The CyberPatriot semifinals just wrapped up. 32 Troy teams and 20 of our supported middle school teams competed in a very, very tough six hour challenge with teams fighting for every point on Saturday, Jan 21. Pretty amazing to have about 2/3rds of our teams still competing after a long season - GO Troy Cyber! Currently, Runtime Terror is first in among all Navy JROTC and All-Service (JROTC, Civil Air Patrol, Naval Sea Cadets), setting

them up for a possible national championship run in Washington DC in March. This team won in 2021 and was 2nd in 2022. Is 2023 going to be another trophy year for them?

Two other Troy teams are in hunt for one of the 12 Open division spots: **Baboons Together Strong** and **CyberSpace**. The scoreboard only lists half of the possible points, and they have legitimate shots of being a nationals qualifier.

We also have a middle school team from Cedarlane Academy, **BubbleGuppies**, that sits at 5th place, just 12 points shy of 3rd. To make it to nationals, they need to be in the top 3. There are 30 possible points not shown on the scoreboard, so they could be another team from Troy Cyber to make it to Washington later this spring."

Late to the press, preliminary scores show Troy's NJROTC Runtime Terror team in 1st nationally, and our Open Team, Baboons Strong Together in 10th place in the Open Division. According to Mr. Stubblefield, if these scores hold, both teams will advance to the Nationals in mid-March! This means we have some paperwork to do for our superintendent and the Board! Our Cyber-Warriors and their coaches have very much gone above and beyond to do the work to be excelling in an area for which there is great need, and impacts all of us. Great job, Warriors!

DEADLINE IS 3:00 PM ON FEBRUARY 3, 2023

NO EXCEPTIONS !!

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

- WHERE TO APPLY
 Applications can <u>ONLY</u> be obtained in person at the school of residence. Applications cannot be mailed or emailed and will not be made available in advance.
- WHAT TO BRING
 Parent/guardian(s) must provide proof of residency within the District at the time of application. A gas, water or electricity bill AND rental agreement/mortgage statement.
- WHAT INFORMATION IS REQUIRED ON THE APPLICATION

The application mainly consists of basic demographic information about your student and is a quick process.

SCHOOL CHOICE
You may apply for only 1 school. If more than 1 application is received for a student, both applications will be voided and student will attend the school of residence.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

- I do not reside within the District, can I apply?

 No, you must be a resident of the Fullerton Joint Union High School District. If you are interested in attending one of our high schools, you may apply for an Interdistrict Transfer release from your district of residence.
- What is the school of residence for my address?
 The school name is contained in the top left corner of the mailing label on this flyer. If you did not receive a flyer or would like to confirm your address, visit:

- Will my student be guaranteed acceptance into school of choice?

 No, acceptance is based on the number of spaces available at each school. Spaces are <u>NOT</u> based on a first-come-first-serve basis. A lottery system will be established if number of applications exceeds the number of spaces.
- ? Is transportation provided?
 No, transportation is not provided.
- Poes Open Enrollment need to be renewed annually? No, it is valid for 4 years; <u>HOWEVER</u> a minimum attendance of 1 school year is required.
