

Award for Aspirations in Computing National Recipient Announcement


I received this information from Troy Computer Science Teacher, Mr. Don Allen on some of our students that have been recognized by the National Center for Women & Information Technology (NCWIT) "Each year, U.S. high school students in grades 9 through 12 who self-identify as women, genderqueer, or non-binary are eligible to receive recognition for their aptitude and aspirations in technology and computing, as demonstrated by their computing experience, computing-related activities, leadership experience, tenacity in the face of barriers to access, and plans for post-secondary education. This year, 40 winners and 360 honorable mentions were selected from more than 4,700 amazing, talented young women."

"Four students from Troy were selected as National Honorable Mention winners. The students are Aishwarya Sitaraman, Megan Loh, Alexis Raya and Jennifer Ho.

This is just the first round of awards, the Award for AiC awards will be announced by the end of March." I am very proud of our students and I am very proud of the fact that we have so very much opportunity for everyone to be successful in the subjects we teach at Troy.
