Fall 2023 Schedule Change Policy

In FJUHSD, the Fall semester deadline to drop an additional class and/or drop course levels (i.e., H/C/IB/AP to the lower level provided there is space), is <u>Friday</u>, October 20th, by 3:30 PM. Per district policy, students in grades 9-11 must be enrolled in a minimum of (6) classes and 12th graders must be enrolled in a minimum of (5) classes. For either change, students must see their school counselor <u>in person</u> before 1st period, at break, lunch, or after 6th period. Parent/guardian permission is required to make any changes.



- List of extracurricular and community activities with accurate Club/Activity Sponsor contact information
- Responses to the following questions. Each essay should be no more than 500 words.
 - Discuss how attending the National Student Leadership Conference will help you fulfill your academic and career goals.
 - Discuss how attending the National Student Leadership Conference will help you improve the leadership culture at your school.
- All this required information must be submitted by the application deadline listed above.


