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The current Science Olympiad National Champions, Troy High School continues to dominate Virtual Science Olympiad Invitational competitions! At the University of Texas Invitational pictured above, Troy finished in 1st Place. At the University of Georgia Invitational, Troy finished in 1st & 5th place. In the Bay Area Science Olympiad, Troy finished 1st Place. I don't know what the future will hold for a Science Olympiad National Championship run this year, as last year's competitions were stopped when COVID-19 hit in the spring. However, I am optimistic our team is going to have the chance to defend their three in a row championships, and win a fourth in a row in 2021! Thank you to Troy Science Olympiad Coach, Mr. Kurt Wahl for providing this Science Olympiad update!

As I wrote earlier regarding the remaining time left in the Fall Semester, we will soon be approaching our Fall Semester Final Exams! Since August this year we have been in school starting the year with a Distance Learning schedule. Earlier this month when we were able to begin the Hybrid Instructional Learning Model, some students returned to campus in one of the
