# **ATTENTION AP STUDENTS & PARENTS!**

Time is running out! Now is time to sign up for AP Exams or you will be paying higher late sign-up fees which rises from the current \$25 to \$40 by Sunday, November 12<sup>th</sup>. Due to the huge number of examinations taken by Troy High School students, a number of years ago we moved to the Total Registration online system for exam registration, cancellation requests, and payments. If you wanted to avoid late sign-up fees you needed to sign up no later than Thursday, November 9<sup>th</sup> to avoid the \$25 late fee will. If you wait until Monday, November 13<sup>th</sup> the late fee rises to \$40. This is the Total Registration site (<u>https://user.totalregistration.net/AP/051009</u>), where to pay for the exams. Students, there are many important reasons to take the AP exams if you are in an AP class. While many colleges and universities give college credit, not all of them do so. You need to know where you are thinking of attending and if they accept AP scores for credit. Also, it is important to recognize there is another benefit to taking an AP exam. Your results are an external measurement of your ability to complete college level work while you are still in high school. Even schools that give no credit for AP exams, such as the Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT) want to see AP, IB, and Cambridge A-Level results to evaluate a potential student's readiness for college level coursework. **THERE IS MUCH VALUE**

Troy Parents, here is some important information on the Free Application for Federal

Student Aid (FAFSA) from our Counselors and Administrative Teams!

Dear Troy High School Senior Parent(s)/Guardian(s),

We would like to provide you with information on state legislation, AB 469. The legislation requires **all California seniors to complete a Free Application for Federal Student Aid** (FAFSA) or California Dream Act (CADAA), and FJUHSD is required to confirm the submission of either application per California Ed Code Section 51225.7. This requirement expands financial aid opportunities for students who may not have the resources to attend a two-year community college or a four-year college or university. The next steps in this process are as follows:

## If your student is a U.S. citizen or eligible non-citizen, they complete the FAFSA

• The FAFSA opens in December 2023 and has a priority closing deadline of April 2, 2024.

• You and your child must create an FSA ID. Your FSA ID is a digital signature used to sign the

FAFSA application. Create your FSA ID now at:

### If your student is undocumented, has or does not have DACA, has Temporary Protected Status or is a U Visa holder, they complete the CADAA

• The CADAA opens in December 2023 and has a priority closing deadline of April 2, 2024.

• The CADAA allows students to apply for state financial aid

The School Counseling Department will be hosting financial aid workshops to help senior students complete either application. Keep an eye on emails regarding these events. If you wish to opt out of completing either financial aid form, have your student see their school counselor during drop-in times for an opt-out form. Please note, opting out means your student will not receive potential federal or state student aid.




