



- Testing for Troy Tech, International Baccalaureate, Cambridge, or Honors placement: January 14, 21, or 28, 2023 (select one) from 7:30-11:45 a.m. Check-in at 7:15 a.m.; January 14 check-in at Library and January 21/28 at North Gym. Bring student photo id or passport and printout of 8th grade schedule listing current math course. Testing covers midyear eighth grade content in math and English, and the format includes multiple-choice questions and an English essay. The best preparation for testing is successful progress in a challenging eighth grade course of study.
