




the Boys' Varsity Halftime, our competition Red Hots Dance Team! A fantastic night, Warriors!

DEADLINE IS 3:00 PM ON FEBRUARY 3, 2023

NO EXCEPTIONS !!

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

- WHERE TO APPLY
 Applications can <u>ONLY</u> be obtained in person at the school of residence. Applications cannot be mailed or emailed and will not be made available in advance.
- WHAT TO BRING
 Parent/guardian(s) must provide proof of residency within the District at the time of application. A gas, water or electricity bill AND rental agreement/mortgage statement.
- WHAT INFORMATION IS REQUIRED ON THE APPLICATION

The application mainly consists of basic demographic information about your student and is a quick process.

SCHOOL CHOICE
You may apply for only 1 school. If more than 1 application is received for a student, both applications will be voided and student will attend the school of residence.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

- I do not reside within the District, can I apply?

 No, you must be a resident of the Fullerton Joint Union High School District. If you are interested in attending one of our high schools, you may apply for an Interdistrict Transfer release from your district of residence.
- What is the school of residence for my address?
 The school name is contained in the top left corner of the mailing label on this flyer. If you did not receive a flyer or would like to confirm your address, visit:

- Will my student be guaranteed acceptance into school of choice?

 No, acceptance is based on the number of spaces available at each school. Spaces are <u>NOT</u> based on a first-come-first-serve basis. A lottery system will be established if number of applications exceeds the number of spaces.
- ? Is transportation provided?
 No, transportation is not provided.
- Poes Open Enrollment need to be renewed annually? No, it is valid for 4 years; <u>HOWEVER</u> a minimum attendance of 1 school year is required.



- 1. Your Social Security Number
- 2. Your Alien Registration Number (if you are not a U.S. citizen)
- 3. Your 2021 federal income tax returns, W-2s, and other records of money earned. (Note: You may be able to transfer your federal tax return information into your FAFSA using the IRS Data Retrieval Tool.)
- 4. Bank statements and records of investments (if applicable)
- 5. Records of untaxed income (if applicable)
- 6.An FSA ID to sign electronically. You must request here: https://studentaid.gov/fsa-id/create-account/launch

To complete the CADAA, please bring:

1. Your 2021 tax information, untaxed income, bank statements, household size, and number in college.
