Henniger and Troy students, Nanette Zhang, Justin Zhao, and Aishwarya Sitaraman. Congratulations, Warriors!



On Tuesday, we hosted five visiting teachers from South Korea when they paid us a visit. Escorted by Superintendent, Dr. Scott Scambray and Dr. Sylvia Kaufman they almost received the full STEM tour of Troy, walking through many of our Science, Technology, Engineering, but not Mathematics classes. They were very impressed with our students and teachers, and were grateful that so many of our students and a couple teachers (Ms. Nga Ngo & Mr. Justin Kim) were able to converse in Korean to describe their work and what it is like being at Troy.



While walking classrooms with our South Korean visitors, we walked into Ms. Nga Ngo's Honors Biology class as they were conducting a unique review. The students were allowed to draw on their lab desks their review. As they did so, Ms. Ngo walked the room and spoke with them about what they obviously knew, and also what they needed to work upon. The review was very interactive and impressive. Awesome!

On another note regarding Science instruction at Troy, the California Department of Education finally released the State Science Exam (CAASPP) test results from 2018-19. The California State average score for meeting or exceeding the Science Standards is 29.36%. Troy's students scored 73.36% vastly surpassing the state average. By the way, the students that took the CAASPP State Exams last year in Mathematics, English, and Science were in the 11th grade and of course are our current 12th grade seniors. In all three California State tested subject areas they posted gains for our school over the previous year, and in the case of Science, this was the first official State score in this subject. 
