It was a convincing win by our team, and we showed the determination that helped this team grind out many one point victories over the past three years. This was not a one point victory as I believe the final score was 3-0. Our Boys' team plays again tomorrow at home against Vista Murietta High School at 3:00pm. Great job Warriors! Yesterday, approximately 100 Troy students were signed up to take the American Mathematics Competition under the watchful eye of Troy Mathematics Department Chair, Mr. Paul Rodriguez. This is a tough competition and nationally only 5% of all students move forward to the American Invitational Mathematics Exam. However, as we just two math teams compete in a Harry Potter themed math competition and one of the teams tied for 2nd place out of over 100 teams from 36 high school from around the country it is likely we will have some students move forward to the next level of competition. Congratulations to Jerry Guo, Rui Wang, Sanat Mishra, and Cassia Yeo on taking 2nd place! Here is another fact about mathematics at Troy. Troy's math department is doing an excellent job with our ninth grade students! It is challenging to teach students that are coming to Troy from over 100 different junior highs with varying math curriculum, some of which are integrated and others traditional math progression. We now have data to show this year's success. Troy had 95% of our ninth grade students passing their math classes based on first semester grades for the 2018-19 school year. The district recently released this data and Troy's math pass rates exceed all other district schools! Looking at Algebra 1 specifically, all Troy Tech students in Algebra 1 are earning A's and B's; success in mathematics also correlates to success in science, tech electives, and overall grades. Congratulations, to our students and teachers on being outstanding and keep up the great work!
