Our week mentally began last Saturday for Troy High School students with Troy's athletes competing in CIF competition, both in a Final and a Masters Tournament. Beginning with Girls' Water Polo, our team had an wonderful season!



The CIF finals were held at Mt. Sac and here is the scoreboard before the start of the

match! It was a great atmosphere at the Final and our team got off to a good start with a 3-1 lead after the 1<sup>st</sup> Quarter. A few tough turnovers later in the 2<sup>nd</sup> it was 3-3 and then 4-3 Chaparral. We went into halftime with a 4-4 score. In the 3<sup>rd</sup> Chaparral scored three and were up 7-4. Our team put together two goals and closed the gap to 6-7 only down by one going into the 4<sup>th</sup> Quarter. With four minutes left in the game, Chaparral had scored three more and it was 10-7 Chaparral. With three minutes left in the game we closed the gap to 8-10 but they scored another goal in what would be the final score of 8-11 and Chaparral won the championship. Former Water Polo player, Assistant Principal Jeff Padgett said that *"We fought hard! They were much bigger and faster than us. We did a really good job!"* I also felt that our team had a great season and should be very proud of what they accomplished this year. Congratulations to our team, Coach Mr. Gary Cheever, and our dedicated parents! We have a young team, and are bringing many of these athletes back next year. They will work to get back to the CIF Final again, and people should expect to see a tough Troy team that continues to build upon their successes!

The Troy Girls Wrestling team as they closed out year. Three weeks prior, Eva Haakinson, Purva Bhatt, and Mattrina Ifopo-Aisea defeated all of their opponents to secure the last Freeway League title for their weight classes. Eva was voted lower weight MVP at 120lbs, while Purva secured upper weight MVP at 137. Mattrina won league as expected at 147. The CIF Individual tournament is a qualifying tournament for the CIF Masters Tournament. The girls have to place in the top 8 to advance to the Masters Meet. Mattrina not only placed in the top 8,



but became <u>the first female</u> in Troy's history to become CIF Champion in her weight class. Her work ethic and enthusiasm paid off. On Saturday, Mattrina defeated her first two opponents at Masters to advance to the semi-finals. She wrapped her season with a loss in the semis to Samantha Acrce (Ranked 4th in the State), in the blood round (a name described by the wrestling community) as the round to get to State. We're extremely proud of her and our Lady Warriors!" We are very proud of our athletes, and coaches! Congratulations to Mattrina on becoming CIF Champion and for having an excellent Masters Tournament. It is a big deal to get to the Masters and to have the ability and technique to get there. Canley for his heroic service in Vietnam, is the experience of a lifetime for our cadets and for me. ## 2024 Spring Semester Schedule Change Policy

The spring semester district deadline to drop an additional class and/or drop course levels (i.e., H/C/IB/AP to the lower level), provided there is space, is <u>Friday, March 15th, by 3:30 PM</u>. Per district policy, students in grades 9-11 must be enrolled in a minimum of (6) classes and 12th graders must be enrolled in a minimum of (5) classes. For either change, students must see their school counselor <u>in person</u> before 1st period, at break, lunch, or after 6th period. Parent/guardian permission is required to make any changes.

<u>**Troy Parents</u>**, from our Counselors and Administrative Team, here is some important information on the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)!</u>

#### Dear Troy High School Senior Parent(s)/Guardian(s),

We would like to provide you with information on state legislation, AB 469. The legislation requires **all California seniors to complete a Free Application for Federal Student Aid** (FAFSA) or California Dream Act (CADAA), and FJUHSD is required to confirm the submission of either application per California Ed Code Section 51225.7. This requirement expands financial aid opportunities for students who may not have the resources to attend a two-year community college or a four-year college or university. The next steps in this process are as follows:

#### If your student is a U.S. citizen or eligible non-citizen, they complete the FAFSA

- The FAFSA is open and has a priority closing deadline of April 2, 2024.
- You and your child must create an FSA ID. Your FSA ID is a digital signature used to sign the

FAFSA application. Create your FSA ID now at:

## If your student is undocumented, has or does not have DACA, has Temporary Protected Status or is a U Visa holder, they complete the CADAA

- The CADAA is open and has a priority closing deadline of April 2, 2024.

• The CADAA allows students to apply for state financial aid

The School Counseling Department will be hosting financial aid workshops to help senior students complete either application. Keep an eye on emails regarding these events. If you wish to opt out of completing either financial aid form, have your student see their school counselor during drop-in times for an opt-out form. Please note, opting out means your student will not receive potential federal or state student aid.
