2024 Spring Semester Schedule Change Policy

The spring semester district deadline to drop an additional class and/or drop course levels (i.e., H/C/IB/AP to the lower level), provided there is space, is <u>Friday</u>, <u>March 15th</u>, by 3:30 <u>PM</u>. Per district policy, students in grades 9-11 must be enrolled in a minimum of (6) classes and 12th graders must be enrolled in a minimum of (5) classes. For either change, students must see their school counselor <u>in person</u> before 1st period, at break, lunch, or after 6th period.

Parent/guardian permission is required to make any changes.

<u>Troy Parents</u>, from our Counselors and Administrative Team, here is some important information on the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)!

Dear Troy High School Senior Parent(s)/Guardian(s),

We would like to provide you with information on state legislation, AB 469. The legislation requires all California seniors to complete a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) or California Dream Act (CADAA), and FJUHSD is required to confirm the submission of either application per California Ed Code Section 51225.7. This requirement expands financial aid opportunities for students who may not have the resources to attend a two-year community college or a four-year college or university. The next steps in this process are as follows:

If your student is a U.S. citizen or eligible non-citizen, they complete the FAFSA

- The FAFSA is open and has a priority closing deadline of April 2, 2024.
- You and your child must create an FSA ID. Your FSA ID is a digital signature used to sign the

FAFSA application. Create your FSA ID now at:

If your student is undocumented, has or does not have DACA, has Temporary Protected Status or is a U Visa holder, they complete the CADAA

- The CADAA is open and has a priority closing deadline of April 2, 2024.

• The CADAA allows students to apply for state financial aid

The School Counseling Department will be hosting financial aid workshops to help senior students complete either application. Keep an eye on emails regarding these events. If you wish to opt out of completing either financial aid form, have your student see their school counselor during drop-in times for an opt-out form. Please note, opting out means your student will not receive potential federal or state student aid.

Who should complete the FAFSA form?

Everyone! There is a new state regulation that requires every high school senior to complete and submit either the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) or the California Dream Act Application (CADAA).

Anyone planning on going to college, whether that be community college, state schools, trade school, or private universities, in the next academic year should fill out the FAFSA/CADAA.

To complete the FAFSA/CADAA you will need:

- 1. Verified account username and password (FSA ID)
- 2. Parent or spouse contributor name, date of birth, Social Security number, and email address
- 3. Income and asset information (if required)





"Saturday proved to be an exhilarating day for Troy's science bowl team as they clinched second place in the regional competition hosted at JPL. The team started strong by overpowering Uni in the initial round robin. As the Round Robin concluded, Troy, University, and Walnut found themselves locked in a three-way tie. In the tiebreaker round, Troy and Uni emerged victorious, advancing to the second-round robin. In the winners' bracket, both teams outperformed Arcadia and Santa Monica, setting the stage for a nail-biting final match between the top two contenders. Despite a valiant effort, Uni narrowly edged past Troy to secure the win. Congratulations are in order for our Troy Team members: Aditya Peddi, Melinda Ji, Chris John, Andy Chen, and Daniel Jiang."

Next week ELPAC (English Language Proficiency Assessment for California) Testing begins. What is this? Students, if you have to ask you are probably not being tested. Here is

more information on the ELPAC from our own Ms. Alma Pulgarin our English Learner Family Liaison for Troy High School.

Hello Troy students,

ELPAC season is upon us! The ELPAC is the English Language Proficiency Assessment for California. This is the language test you take every spring. It consists of 4 domains (speaking, writing, listening, and reading). We will begin pulling students out for the speaking component **next Tuesday, February 6th.** Please take your time and do your best! You each have the ability to improve on your score from last year!

9th-10th grade testing: **Tuesday, February 13th, during periods 1-4.** 11th-12th grade testing: **Wednesday, February 14th, during periods 1-4.**

The following are the criteria for reclassification. When you reclassify, you will no longer need to take this test and will be considered as English Proficient:

- 1. Obtain a Level 4 Overall on the ELPAC
 - a. You can receive a 3 on the Written or Oral portions and still get a 4 Overall score.
- 2. C- or above in your English class for a SEMESTER
 - a. I look at your most recent English grade.
- 3. Meets or exceeds **ONE** of the following assessments/benchmarks:
 - a. CAASPP/SBAC ELA score of 3+ (CAASPP 2 AND a GPA 3.0+) From 8th or 11th grade
 - b. ELA Benchmark Score of 2+ (Common Lit assessment): taken 3 times a year
 - c. SAT/PSAT (Score 25th Percentile or Higher)
 - d. Reading Assessment: Nelson-Denny score of 30 points or higher (M50 or T25).
- 4. Parent/Guardian Consent
 - a. Phone call and letter home as evidence of parent/guardian consultation in the RFEP process and District determination of the student's RFEP status.

Please remember to charge your Chromebooks before your testing date. Also, if you have headphones, please bring them.
