

Our FJUHSD Food Services Division serves many meals a day to students in our district. At Troy our team serves between 400-650 lunches each day. From the beginning of the year to now district-wide there have been 97,999 meals served to our students in the first year of the California Universal Meal Program, which is mandated that meals are available to all students, regardless of financial need.
