We are back in session, 3rd Quarter grades are in the books, Spring Break is over, now is when our spring testing season begins. Next week our California State testing begins with the CAASPP / SBAC testing begins in English, Math, and Science. We will be in block schedule but school start and end times remain the same. These exams are great opportunities to get into the testing mindset and have an external measurement of what student's know. Additionally the California State University system also uses them for Math and English placement, so they have additional value for students thinking of attending Cal State Fullerton. Lastly, with the high level of critical thinking and rigorous level of standards based questions, these California State exams are also great practice for the AP and IB examinations, as over time the College Board /Advanced Placement (AP) and International Baccalaureate (IB) have been adjusting their testing formats to be more similar with California State testing and vice versa. By the end of April the AP and IB examinations will be in full testing force and with these exams combined, our students will take well over 3600 total exams! After AP/IB exams, we have Troy's Final Exams and the end of the year, followed by the Class of 2018 Graduation on May 31st at 7:00pm!





Track and Field had a big week with two Track & Field meets due to the rainout before Spring Break! I am happy to report that our team is looking great with all levels winning on Tuesday vs. Buena Park High School and then again yesterday vs. La Habra High School! Go Warriors! Our next home track meet will be on the new all-weather surface in the Fullerton Stadium, and we are super excited to be on that surface. Last week the California State Superintendent of Education, Mr. Tom Torlakson and California Secretary of State, Mr. Alex Padilla sent a joint communication to County and District Superintendents and High School Principal regarding High School Voter Education Weeks, April 16-27, 2018. "As we approach the upcoming statewide primary and general elections this

June and November, it is important to ensure that our students are learning to become active and engaged participants in our democracy. It is never too early to motivate your students to get involved. That's why we strongly encourage your school to observe High School Voter Education Weeks on April 16-27 to put your students on the path to a lifetime of civic engagement and voting. With online pre-registration available for sixteen- and seventeen-yearolds, it's easier than ever to get students prepared to cast their own ballots. Once pre-registered, they will automatically become active voters on their 18th birthday. California Education Code designates the last two weeks of April and September as "High School Voter Education Weeks" and authorizes schools to designate students as "voter outreach coordinators." With county elections officials as partners, we provide resources to make it easy for schools to participate. Teachers can help eligible students pre-register or register to vote either on a paper form or online. Voter outreach coordinators can lead registration drives and other school activities aimed at civic participation. We encourage you to make High School Voter Education Weeks just the start...Eligible students to vote may visit http://registertovote.ca.gov/ to register or pre- register to vote. Working together, we can educate and encourage our young citizens to register to vote and turn out at the polls to ensure their voices are heard in 2018 and beyond.
