Our students continue to be involved in the virtual world just like in virtual Online Troy High School! Commander Lauper reported some interesting voluntary learning opportunities some cadets took advantage of when they watched the webinar with Admiral James Stavridis, Admiral William H. McRaven and USN Shannon Bream regarding *Leadership and a New World Order: The Need for Resilience*. I cannot think of a more timely topic for discussion and study!

Also, congratulations to our NJROTC National Academic Exam teams for dominating Area 11! There were 1,609 teams nationally and 142 teams in Area 11 that participated and took this test. For reference, Area 11 consists of NJROTC programs in Arizona and Southern California. Each school can have up to five teams in the competition and each team consists of five cadets and they answer questions in a timed, online competition. Here were the results!

Team #1 took 1<sup>st</sup> in Area 11 and 3<sup>rd</sup> in the USA.

Team #2 took 2<sup>nd</sup> in Area 11 and 7<sup>th</sup> in the USA.

Team #3 took 6<sup>th</sup> in Area 11 and 35<sup>th</sup> in the USA.

Team #4 took 8<sup>th</sup> in Area 11 and 74<sup>th</sup> in the USA.

Team #5 took 11<sup>th</sup> in Area 11 and 85<sup>th</sup> in the USA.

Overall, I think these cadets more than represented Area 11 and Troy High School both in Area 11 and nationally! Go Warriors!

Lastly in Troy NJROTC news, we have a number of students receiving both ROTC scholarships to college and Academy appointments. From Commander Lauper:

As I continue to build the list of what our 54 senior Cadets are doing next fall, the list below shows which of our Cadets have received funded educational opportunities from our Armed Forces, which, when completed, will result in a Bachelor's Degree and a commission as an Officer. This is a very selective process. Each candidate must qualify academically, physically, and medically. In an age where only 30% of today's youth meet the minimum requirements to serve, the results are a testament to our Troy students. Final notifications are due on April 15th, so we may see a couple more...

The following have been awarded an estimated combined total of up to \$3.0 million in educational value and the opportunity to be commissioned as an Officer (because some have multiple offers, the total amount awarded is greater than the amount than can be executed):


Still waiting on a couple more decisions...
