Last weekend, I worked the 49<sup>th</sup> Annual Arcadia High School Invitational Track & Field Meet as one of the officials. I have been involved in this event since I was a student athlete and one of the meet workers as a student at Arcadia in the 1980's. This year I was one of the High Jump officials, but while there I had the opportunity to take a few pictures of a first for Troy High School at the Arcadia Invitational. Last summer Troy had three siblings from the State of Nevada transfer to our school. As it turned out one of them, plays baseball. The other two are different, for Greg and Amanda Mohr their sport is the Pole Vault, and they are good. Amanda has jumped 11'0" and Greg has jumped over 15'0". That these two students would be pole vaulters would not normally be unusual except that the Fullerton Joint Union High School District does not have the Pole Vault in any of their schools and has not for over 20 years. However, now Troy does—sort of. The Freeway League agreed to allow Greg and Amanda to

represent Troy at non-league away meets where most of the teams against which we compete have the pole vault. Finally we were able to gain points in meets that we usually had to give away because we did not have any competitors! Additionally, Greg was able to qualify for the Arcadia Invitational because of his marks achieved in prior track & field meets this year. Greg Mohr became the first Troy athlete to represent Troy High School in the Arcadia Invitational in many years, and I believe he is our first pole vaulter! As can be seen in the picture, the weather was not great, and it was actually raining most of the day. While Greg performed well, the weather played havoc with the field events, especially the pole vault with none of the vaulters having a banner day. That being said, congratulations to Greg Mohr for breaking this barrier for Troy High School!

Our Troy Track & Field Team is having a great season, and will be competing today against Fullerton High School at 3:00pm. There will be no pole vault, but all the other events are in competition!



"The National Finalists will compete at Marymount University, Arlington, VA for the USABO National Finals, from May 29 to June 10 (cost-free!). USABO Finalists are immersed in lectures and laboratories led by leading scientists and researchers in the fields of biology. Finalists take a three-hour theoretical exam and six-hour practical exam. The top four scorers become the 2016 Team USA and will represent the United States in Hanoi, Vietnam from July 17 to 24, 2016." Great job Warriors, and best wishes on making the US team and winning the World Championship!

Congratulations to Troy's Cyber Security teams for their achievement at the National Championships held in Baltimore, Maryland! In the third year of competition for Troy, our teams have placed #14 and #4 in the past two years. This year we finished in 2<sup>nd</sup> place! Commander, Allen Stubblefield provided more details from the event, "Troy's team number one finished second in the nation, while our number two team was in the top 10! Our teams competed in network security incident response and operational system security." Commander Stubblefield also described how at the Nationals, Troy competed against teams from throughout the nation and that prior to the Nationals, the season began with 1200 teams in our division alone! 


Cyber Security Nationals 2016
