## OCDE CRISIS RESPONSE NETWORK THINGS TO TRY

GRADES: 7-12

Go for a walk/run/hike

Talk about your feelings to someone you trust

Schedule time to relax

Do not self-medicate, if you need help ask for it

Spend time outside

Volunteer to help someone else

Spend time with friends or family

Ask your loved ones how they are doing

Eat regular meals, even if you don't feel like it

Hug someone you care about

Get a good night's sleep

Read a good book

Start a project

Plant some flowers

Keep busy

Meditate

Don't be afraid to ask for help, you have been through a lot, there are people who can help you

#### Tips for Family and Friends

Listen carefully

Spend time with the affected person

Offer to help or talk, even if they do not ask

Do not take offense to anger or outbursts

Comfort him/her

Help him/her with chores or homework

Give him/her private time when they ask, but let him/her know you are there when they are ready

Do not tell him/her that they are "lucky it wasn't worse." Instead say that you are sorry they have to go through this.

Next Thursday, on April 25<sup>th</sup> is our annual Troy Tech Fair. It will be held in both the North and South Gyms and is a wonderful event, featuring the 385 Troy Tech Interns from our Class of 2019. Our students had some wonderful learning opportunities through their internship

opportunities and this event is a fantastic opportunity for them to share their internship sites and experiences. The event runs much of the day and is open to different groups at specific times. At 8:30am, 5<sup>th</sup> grade students from Acacia will be here. During 2<sup>nd</sup> period Troy Tech 11<sup>th</sup> graders will be tour the fair. 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> period, assigned classes will visit the fair. 12:15pm, the fair closes and will reopen at 5:30pm for families in the North Gym for incoming 9<sup>th</sup> graders. At 6:00pm until 7:15pm the North and South Gyms are open for the Troy Tech Fair for all families. At 7:30-8:30pm, Troy Tech Senior Recognition will be held in the North Gym.



The same day as our Troy Tech Fair, at 2:00pm in the Lecture Hall we will be hosting Congressional Medal of Honor recipient, Sgt. 1<sup>st</sup> Class Leroy Petry, U.S. Army. He received this recognition for actions above and beyond the call of duty in Afghanistan in 2008 and he will be having a discussion with our NJROTC cadets. Sgt 1<sup>st</sup> Class Petry is one of 71 living Medal of Honor recipients and we are humbled to have him visit our school and have this opportunity to meet him and hear his story.

Last weekend, our Drum Line took another 1<sup>st</sup> Place at the Semi-Finals at Ontario High School. We are in the finals on April 27<sup>th</sup> at Azusa Pacific University! They have a week to continue to hone their sound, although by the look of their run they are playing very, very, well!

Last weekend, some amazing Troy students competed in Economic Olympiad at CSUF. Their coach and teacher, Mr. David St. Clair has the details. "...Dayne Tran and Ryan Li competed against schools from LA and Orange County in the Economic Olympiad. There were five events in the competition. Stock market, personal finance, business news, business plan and economic video. Dayne placed 2nd in the business news and personal finance competitions. Ryan placed 2nd in the stock market contest and tied Dayne for 2nd in the personal finance competition. He placed 3rd in the business news competition. Overall Dayne won \$400 and Ryan \$500. A very productive and efficient day!" Congratulations, on another financially lucrative day for our students!


To our Troy alum, thank you very much for writing this letter. It means more than you know. Warriors, forever!
