One hundred and three sophomores from Ms. Park's English II Honors classes created personalized storybooks for the young visitors. 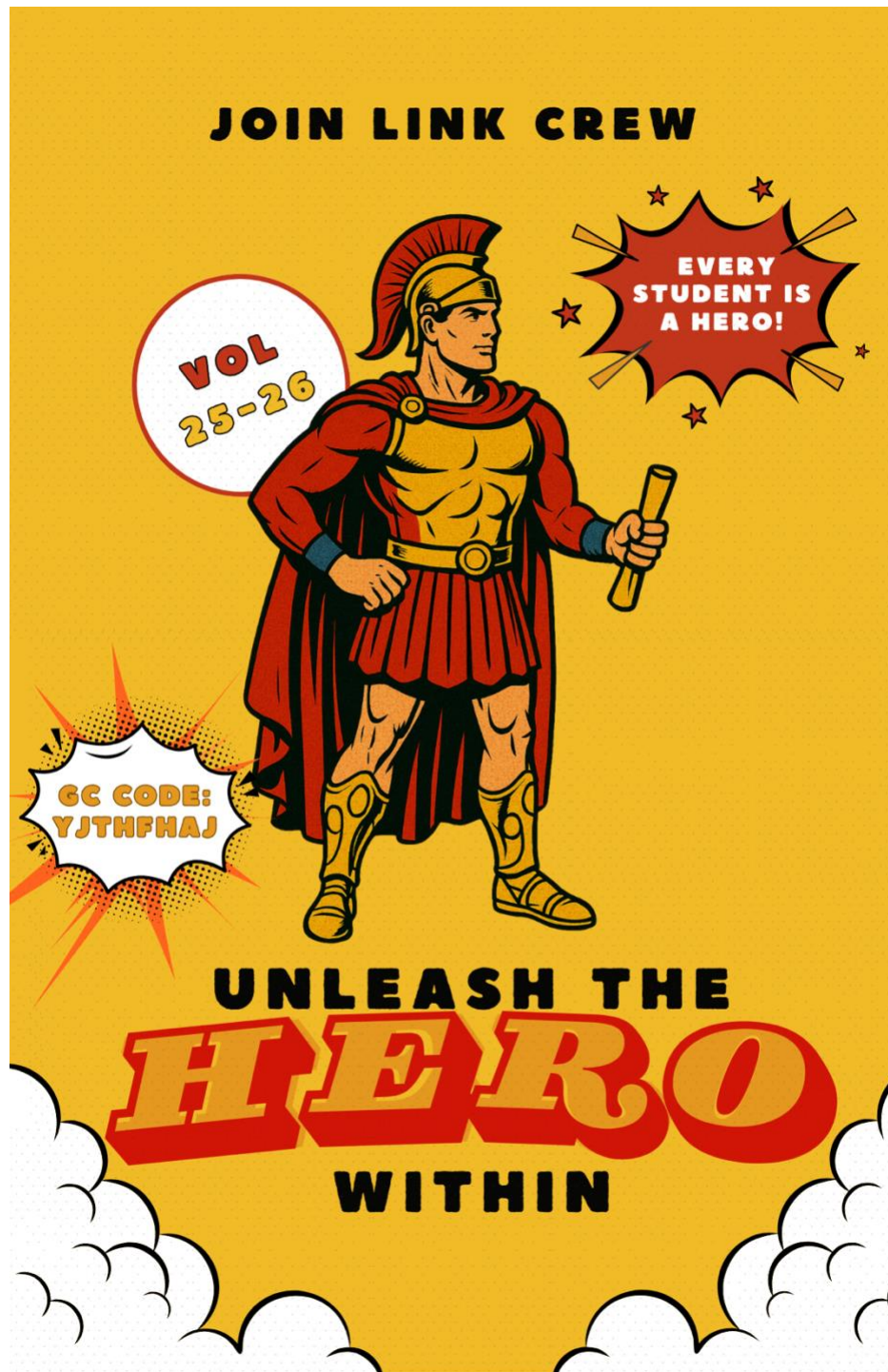
