Warriors,

It has been a busy week at Troy High School! I am grateful for our Teachers this Teacher Appreciation Week, but to be fair we are all grateful for our teachers every single day. It is nice to have at least a week for Teachers. Another celebration that is being observed today is "Celebrating our School Lunch Heroes!" Last week State Superintendent of Public Instruction, Tony Thurmond sent out the following notification regarding the important contributions to our schools by our school nutrition professionals. "I am extremely pleased to share with you that School Lunch Hero Day is Friday, May 7, 2021. School Lunch Hero Day is a day when schools and community members can show their appreciation for the important work that school nutrition professionals do each and every day to provide nutritious meals to California's students. School nutrition professionals have always supported student success and learning by providing nutritious meals and snacks throughout the school year and during the summer. Students who eat school meals have lower rates of food insecurity, lower rates of obesity, and overall better health. Students who eat school meals have improved attendance, behavior, academic performance, and achievements as well as decreased tardiness. Historically, California's child nutrition programs served a billion meals and snacks annually. This year, school nutrition professionals were called to do more than ever before. In comparison to the

same month in the year before, meals served during June 2020 increased by over 66 percent, and meals served in July 2020 increased by an astonishing 360 percent. School nutrition professionals rose to the challenge presented by the COVID-19 without hesitation—adjusting meal service hours, providing home delivery and grab-and-go options, adding additional meals, and expanding service so that children from all California communities continued to have dependable access to healthy food during the COVID-19 pandemic. Today, more than ever, these professionals embody the essence of the word "hero."



From Girls' Golf Coach, Mr. Jerry Cowgill! "The girls golf team finished their league season with a perfect 10-0 record, claiming their 6th straight Freeway League Title. The team, by way of its 1st place finish in league, also earned a berth in the CIF Team Competition on June 8, seeking to win their 4th straight CIF Team title and 5th in 7 years. Juniors Victoria Choi and Jacqueline Lui will also play in the team portion.

MAY 2021 AP EXAM DETAILS AND INSTRUCTIONS

For MORNING Exams:

- · Report to campus at 7:00 AM to the entrance near the North Gym.
- You will complete the daily check-in process (i.e., Since cell phones are not allowed in the exam,
 Qualtrics will not be used for checking in. Rather, students will complete a paper screening form with
 any recent symptoms, receive a temperature check and obtain a wristband before proceeding to the
 exam.)
- · Please proceed directly to your testing room and line up for check-in.

For AFTERNOON Exams:

- . Report to campus at 11:00 AM to the entrance near the North Gym.
- You will complete the daily check in process (i.e., Since cell phones are not allowed in the exam,
 Qualtrics will not be used for checking in. Rather, students will complete a paper screening form with
 any recent symptoms, receive a temperature check and obtain a wristband before proceeding to the
 exam.)
- · Please proceed directly to your testing room and line up for check-in.

YOU ARE TO READ ALL EMAIL COMMUNICATION FROM TOTAL REGISTRATION REGARDING YOUR EXAMS AND EXAM LOCATIONS.



Bring ONLY the following items in a clear plastic bag:

- A photo ID (i.e., student ID card, passport, or California issued ID or driver's license card)
- Sharpened number two pencils.
- · A few pens with blue or black ink.
- An approved calculator, if needed for the exam. A list of approved calculators may be found here: https://apstudents.collegeboard.org/exam-policies-guidelines/calculator-policies
- · Optional: A clear, plastic disposable water bottle with the label removed (no reusable water bottles allowed).



The following items are prohibited. If a student is observed with any of these items during testing or breaks they may be dismissed from the exam, the device may be confiscated, the student's score may be canceled, and no retest will be permitted:

- · No purses, bags or backpacks of any kind.
- No electronic equipment including phones, smartwatches, fitness trackers, wearable technology, cameras, recording or listening devices, or any other type of electronic or communication device. The only exceptions to the above restrictions are Chromebooks or other devices specifically required to be used for in-school digital testing.
- No books, reference guides, notes, compasses, protractors, mechanical pencils, pencils that are not No. 2, correction fluid, dictionaries, highlighters, or colored pencils.
- · No scratch paper. Scratch paper will be provided, if allowed.
- · No watches that beep, make a noise, or have an alarm.
- No calculators that are not approved.
- · No reference guides, keyboard maps, or other typing instructions.
- No ear plugs.
- No clothing or shoes with subject-related information.
- No food or drink. Note: You may access free meals at the cafeteria before school, at break, or at lunch.
- No clipboards.
