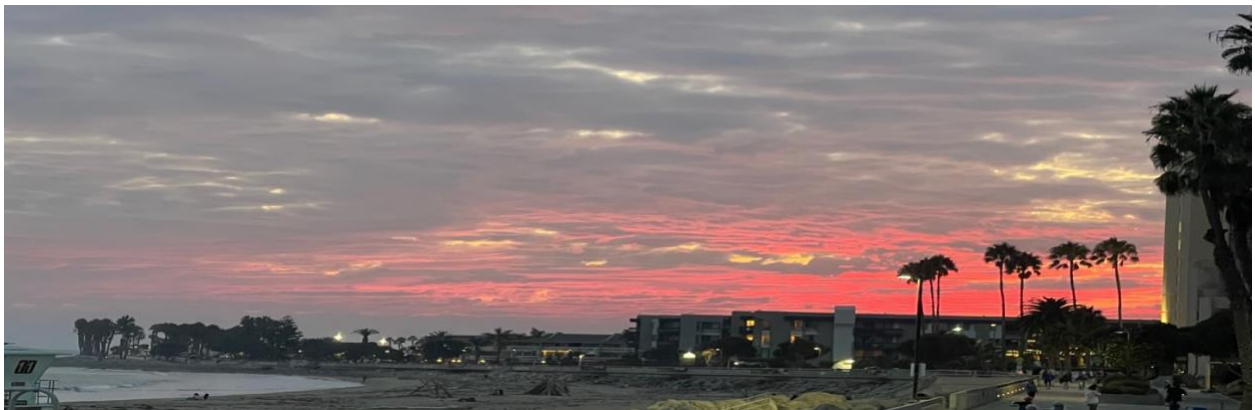

Fall 2023 Schedule Change Policy

In FJUHSd, the Fall semester deadline to drop an additional class and/or drop course levels (i.e., H/C/IB/AP to the lower level provided there is space), is Friday, October 20th, by 3:30 PM. Per district policy, students in grades 9-11 must be enrolled in a minimum of (6) classes and 12th graders must be enrolled in a minimum of (5) classes. For either change, students must see their school counselor in person before 1st period, at break, lunch, or after 6th period. Parent/guardian permission is required to make any changes.

All applications must be submitted by: **Friday March 1, 2024**, via email to

Each scholarship recipient will receive fully paid tuition to the NSLC and \$500 reimbursement for airfare. This is a 6-day program at either Georgetown University or the University of Miami in June or July 2024. Program highlights include a community service project, learning effective leadership skills, goal setting sessions and finding inspiration through others. - Provide a copy of your current academic transcript. This transcript may be “unofficial” or a scanned copy.
- Provide a letter of recommendation from your ASB Advisor
- Provide your total household income (in US Dollars)
- List of extracurricular and community activities with accurate Club/Activity Sponsor contact information
- Responses to the following questions. Each essay should be no more than **500 words**.
 - Discuss how attending the National Student Leadership Conference will help you fulfill your academic and career goals.
 - Discuss how attending the National Student Leadership Conference will help you improve the leadership culture at your school.
- All this required information must be submitted by the application deadline listed above.
