COVID-19 Reminder for all Troy High School Students!

In accordance with the Center for Disease Control (CDC), CA Dept. of Public Health (CDPH), and Orange County Health Care Agency (OCHCA), we ask that you complete the Qualtrics survey each morning prior to arriving on campus. However, **please do not attend** <u>school</u> if you have experienced any COVID-related symptoms:

- Flu-like symptoms such as fever of 100.4 or greater
- Chills
- Cough
- Sore throat
- Runny or stuffy nose that is not associated with a pre-existing condition or other chronic health condition.

Following the recommendations issued by the Centers for Disease Control (CDC), the California Department of Public Health (CDPH) has issued guidance in support of full in-person instruction and to as much instructional time as possible. A link to that guidance is included at the bottom of this communication.

Please note that masks will be required by all staff and students while indoors

regardless of vaccinated status.As an extra precaution, FJUHSD is committed to continuingthe enhanced cleaning procedures established to ensure that our schools are clean, sanitized, andsafe. Additionally, using our thermal cameras, temperatures will continue to be taken eachmorning.CDPH COVID-19/K-12-Guidance

Safety Procedures for attending school during the COVID-19 pandemic.

- All students and staff will complete a Qualtrics COVID Safety Survey each morning (the survey will be sent to your school email).
- To enter campus, students will show their green checkmark from the completed survey permitting them to be on campus.
- Students will walk through the thermo-imaging temperature cameras by either the Main Office or the North Gym and show their green Qualtrics survey checkmarks.
- Face coverings (masks) are required inside and are optional while outside.

Last but not least, <u>if you have taken a COVID-19 test</u> and are still waiting for results, <u>please do not attend school until you receive the results of that test</u>, and then <u>only</u> <u>come to school if you are negative for COVID-19!</u>

We have now passed two years since the beginning of the COVID-19 pandemic which began in October, 2019. We clearly remember the school closures in California that began at the close of day on March 13, 2020 and the lockdown that followed. It was on that day the pandemic became real to all of us...Since then, we have been through some difficult days. With persistance we have pushed through to better days, working our way back to the point we are able to do many of the things we used to do before COVID-19. No, things are not normal and we are masked up in most places. But we are able to be together and that really makes all the difference in the world. We are not yet done!

Now is not the time to get complacent. We are seeing a significant uptick in the number of COVID-19 cases throughout the world, country, state, cities. We have seen this before, but then all we could do is wait while in lockdown or Distance Learning for another way to defend ourselves against this disease. Last spring, by March / April of 2021, the COVID-19 vaccines became available for large portions of the population, and that availability has only accelerated since. 
"Our 3rd round of the year is this weekend. We have **50 Troy teams** competing, all hoping to do well enough to advance to the semi-finals on Jan 22.

Teams of 4-6 students have *6 hours* to make their virtual <u>Windows 10, Windows Server</u> <u>and Ubuntu 20</u> computers as secure as possible while also <u>configuring a simulated network</u>.

For this round, teams are competing based on their tier which is based on their performance in the first two rounds. Platinum tier: top 30%, Gold tier: middle 40% and Silver tier: remaining 30%). A testament to the effectiveness of our weekly practices is that 44 of our Troy teams are in Platinum, with 5 in Gold and 1 in Silver. This also means that 72 of our 94 freshmen are on Platinum tier teams!

Teams must make the top 25% of their tier to advance to the semi-finals. Historically, 50% of our teams achieve this mark." I will say this much, I am so very thankful we have the

Cyber program at Troy High School! There is seemingly a never ending demand for people with cyber skills to thwart the criminals that seek to disrupt our lives in numerous ways. We need people to be our cyber defenders, and if our students find cyber to be their calling there are many colleges, then businesses that will happily bring them into the fold! 


