Mr. Kent Goodman, who is one of two Troy advisors / coaches along with Mr. Mike Reid for our team, sent out this much anticipated email to our staff describing this win!

"Mike Reid and I have been waiting a long time to send this email:) Eleven years of blood, sweat, tears, and broken parts and we finally did it! We were part of the winning 3-team alliance (Code Orange-Irvine, High Rollers-Las Vegas) at the Orange County Regional Competition this weekend. Forty two teams from California and beyond competed at the OC Fairgrounds (NV, CO, Mexico, Turkey). With the victory we received an invitation to the FIRST Robotics International Championship in Houston, Texas.

Mike and I have been so impressed with the students' dedication to the team and their work ethic year after year. All the long hours after school and very long days on the weekends brainstorming, coding, sketching, designing, manufacturing, and assembling the robot finally paid off with a championship. This year's robot was REALLY good at the one thing the other teams in our alliance needed us to do while they were accomplishing other tasks: climb the three monkey bars consistently without failing for three rounds of playoffs. My students told their new playoff alliance teammates that they could count on us to do it every time without failure (I was close to cardiac arrest with visions of past broken robot parts). Troy's robot did it flawlessly 6 times in a row and helped our team go undefeated in the playoffs. We compete next in the Los Angeles Regional and then it's off to the Championship. Go Warriors!"



I wrote of wonderful our instrumental music performers last week, and I now have a photo from one of their events last week! We still have more opportunities to hear them play this year. Go, Warriors!



COVID-19 Reminder for all Troy High School Students!

In accordance with the Center for Disease Control (CDC), CA Dept. of Public Health (CDPH), and Orange County Health Care Agency (OCHCA), we ask that you complete the Qualtrics survey each morning prior to arriving on campus. However, **please do not attend school** if you have experienced any COVID-related symptoms:

- Flu-like symptoms such as fever of 100.4 or greater
- Chills
- Cough
- Sore throat
- Runny or stuffy nose that is not associated with a pre-existing condition or other chronic health condition.

Each year, a student is elected from one of the seven high schools to be a member of the Fullerton Joint Union High School District Board of Trustees. The student member attends all open Board meetings as the representative of the District's students. The student sits on the Board with the other five adult members who are chosen in local elections. The two major responsibilities of the Student Board Member are (1) attend all open Board meetings and (2) preside as chairperson over the Student Advisory Council (SAC), a committee made up of each school's ASB president and two additional members from each school. Board meetings are held once a month in the Education Center Board Room at 6:00 p.m. Student Board Member presents an oral report at each meeting and attends all Regular Board meetings. The report can cover a variety of issues from focusing on individual campus activities to District activities that involve the students and/ or student opinions about current or proposed school policies. As chairperson of SAC, the Student Board Member is encouraged to hold monthly meetings, but may schedule meetings at his/her discretion. SAC meetings are an ideal time to discuss not only issues facing the individual campuses, but also to share ideas and interact with other students from the seven campuses Districtwide. The position of Student Board Member requires a significant

commitment of time to: (1) prepare for and attend Board meetings; (2) prepare for and chair SAC meetings; (3) organize SAC activities, which includes a District Spring Activity and a fall symposium on District issues of importance; and (4) represent District students on District committees and task forces as needed. It is important to remember that the Student Board Member represents all students and should, therefore, be aware of current concerns. Attached is an application for the position of Student Board Member. Any student attending a Fullerton Joint Union High School District school who meets eligibility requirements for extracurricular activities and will be a senior for the 2022/23 school year may apply to be the Student Board Member. The application must be returned with one (only) teacher or staff member recommendation to your Principal by Friday, April 8, 2022. Candidates will be interviewed by members of the SAC on Wednesday, April 27, at the District Office in the Board Room. You will be notified by your District email as to your interview time. To be considered for the position of Student Board Member, you must be present for the interview on Wednesday, April 27. If necessary, paper screening of the submitted applications will take place to select those applicants who will be interviewed. During the interview, all candidates will be asked to articulate personal experiences, background, skills, knowledge, and motivation that will serve them well if selected as the Student Board Member. After the interviews and a review of each application, the SAC will vote; each school will have one vote to cast. The results of the election will be announced on May 10, 2022, after interviews are completed. All candidates are invited to attend the Board meeting on April 12, 2022, at 6:00 p.m. to observe more about the position of Student Board Member. 22/23 Student Board Member Application
