'Everyday activities will be allowed and businesses can open with common-sense risk reduction measures,' the governor's office said in a statement. 'We can now begin planning for our lives post-pandemic,' Newsom said in the statement. 'We will need to remain vigilant, and continue the practices that got us here — wearing masks and getting vaccinated — but the light at the end of this tunnel has never been brighter.' 


Luna is following the COVID protocols we have in place and is wearing the same bracelet all students received on Tuesday. The bracelet changes each day.

Here is some amazing Troy Tech news from our Coordinator, Ms. Laurie Downum-Bonnett! On Thursday, April 29, 2021, the Troy community will have the opportunity to celebrate our 415 Troy Tech Seniors and their Internships at the Virtual Troy Tech Fair! In the midst of the pandemic, these seniors completed meaningful internships virtually or inperson. Each Troy Tech Senior will have a slide representing their internship in a compiled slideshow. On the day of the Troy Tech Fair, Thursday, April 29th, a link to the slideshow will be made available to all Troy students and families through Aeries Communications.

Here is one example of what the Seniors will be sharing that day: Troy Tech Senior Veebha Havaldar was recently published based on her virtual internship last summer at The Lundquist Institute for Biomedical Innovation. During her internship, she worked in Dr. Virender Rehan's neonatology lab investigating the effects of maternal use of electronic cigarettes on fetal development of the airway asthmatic phenotype. The first three weeks consisted of a series of engaging and detailed lectures given by the researchers at the Lundquist Institute. Then she was placed in a virtual lab with a researcher. She was able to get her first official research experience and publication as well as confirm her interests in the field of biomedical engineering. Next year she will be studying biomedical engineering with a pre medical track and is deciding between Vanderbilt, Georgia Tech, and Case Western Reserve University. Reminder! I have run this story in a couple previous *Warrior Weekly* issues, but it remains highly relevant and I want to again express how thrilled I am that the light at the end of the tunnel regarding the end of this pandemic is getting very close! Here is the story previously included, but bears repeating.

Our current Hybrid and Online Learning Model goes away with the end of SB98 on June 30, 2021. California schools will return to regular comprehensive school education for five days each week this upcoming Fall, 2021. "The distance learning and Principal Apportionment statutes established in SB 98 and SB 820 will become inoperative on June 30, 2021. All of the

instructional time and attendance accounting requirements in place prior to FY 2020–21 will be back in effect for FY 2021–22 (California Department of Education)."

Mobile Hot Spots

Dear Troy Students and Parents, if you or your student received a WiFi hot spot at some point in the last year and no longer needs it, please make sure you return the hot spot to school as soon as possible. While they are free for our students use, they incur significant costs to our school district, which if they are needed by the student is perfectly ok. However, if they are not still being used, it is a waste of resources. If you are still using the hotspot, you may keep it through the end of the school year and summer if you are a student taking summer school. These hotspots were checked out under each student's school account, and just like textbooks show up as a fee if not returned. For seniors, like textbooks, a non-returned WiFi hotspot might put a hold on the check-out process at the end of the year. If you have any questions regarding how and when to return your hotspot, please give us a call.

Dear FJUHSD Parents/Guardians.

On March 30, 2021, the FJUHSD Board of Trustees approved modification of the hybrid learning model by combining Cohorts A & B and increasing in-person instruction from two days per week to four days per week (Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday) beginning Monday, April 19, 2021. Students can choose to be on campus four days per week for in-person instruction for the remainder of the school year, or choose to be in a 100% Distance Learning Model for the remainder of the school year. FJUHSD will continue to adhere to all COVID-19 health and safety guidelines as set forth by the California Department of Public Health and Orange County Health Care Agency.

Important:

- Families will be required to make a decision about whether their student(s) will attend
 in-person or remotely and commit to one form of instruction from April 19 until the last
 day of school.
- Follow the instructions below to login to the Aeries Parent Portal to indicate your instructional model choice of in-person instruction 4 days/week or 100% distance learning by Wednesday, April 14, 2021, at 11:59 p.m.
- . Going forward, switching between in-person and remote will not be permitted.
- If you do not login to Aeries and commit to one form of instruction by Wednesday, April
 14, your student(s) will automatically be placed in the instructional model they are
 currently in, be it in-person instruction or fully online.

Instructions: To choose your student(s) instructional model for the remainder of the school year in Aeries, please do the following:

- 1. Login to the Aeries Parent Portal with a Parent Account at https://mystudent.fjuhsd.org
- 2. Choose Student Info > Data Confirmation.
- Click on the "Authorizations Section," and select "Yes" for In-Person Learning or "No" for Distance Learning question and click "Save."

If you need assistance accessing the Aeries Parent Portal, please contact your school site. Please note that this decision is final and students will not be able to move back and forth between cohorts. In addition, all cohort A/B (in-person) students will be allowed 3 absences where they can Zoom from home. Once the third absence has occurred, site administrators will disable the ability for students to Zoom from home.
