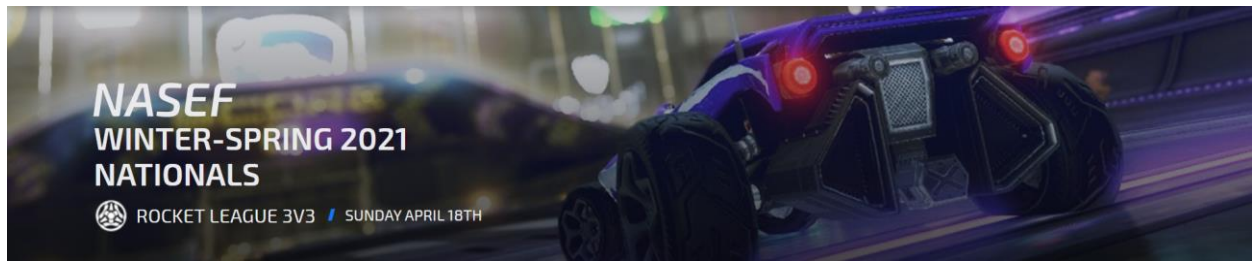

Mobile Hot Spots!!!

Dear Troy Students and Parents, if you or your student received a WiFi hot spot at some point in the last year and no longer needs it, please make sure you return the hot spot to school as soon as possible. While they are free for our students use, they incur significant costs to our school district, which if they are needed by the student is perfectly ok. However, if they are not still being used, it is a waste of resources. If you are still using the hotspot, you may keep it through the end of the school year and summer if you are a student taking summer school. These hotspots were checked out under each student's school account, and just like textbooks show up as a fee if not returned. For seniors, like textbooks, a non-returned WiFi hotspot might put a hold on the check-out process at the end of the year.
